

Chapter 1 : Jim Carter - IMDb

Within the last several years, Carson lost his six-year-old son, Devin, to leukemia; his business development manager, Les Nichols, to pancreatic cancer; and his planning department manager, Bob Counts, to a massive stroke. And yet he still smiles. And still seeks to serve. The organization sponsors hikes, marathons and century bike rides that task participants to raise money for cancer cures. A blood drive has already been held and other charity events will follow, perhaps Habit for Humanity, Rappahannock Rough Ride helps fund the Fauquier and Rappahannock County free clinics and more. We can use that resource for good. Can Do will work hard to make it happen. The ladies hike the second Sunday of the month starting in the morning and conclude with a stop at a local winery or restaurant to rehydrate. It was fun, happy and healthy!
