Pre-colonial period Kumeyaay people lived in San Diego before Europeans settled there. The original inhabitants of the region are now known as the San Dieguito and La Jolla people. Two seaborne parties reached San Diego Bay: It was the first settlement by Europeans in what is now the state of California. In , Mexico began attempting to extend its authority over the coastal territory of Alta California. The fort on Presidio Hill was gradually abandoned, while the town of San Diego grew up on the level land below Presidio Hill. Americans gained increased awareness of California, and its commercial possibilities, from the writings of two countrymen involved in the often officially forbidden, to foreigners, but economically significant hide and tallow trade, where San Diego was a major port and the only one with an adequate harbor: At first they had an easy time of it capturing the major ports including San Diego, but the Californios in southern Alta California struck back. Following the successful revolt in Los Angeles , the American garrison at San Diego was driven out without firing a shot in early October Mexican partisans held San Diego for three weeks until October 24, , when the Americans recaptured it. For the next several months the Americans were blockaded inside the pueblo. Skirmishes occurred daily and snipers shot into the town every night. The Californios drove cattle away from the pueblo hoping to starve the Americans and their Californio supporters out. Stockton sent a mounted force of fifty under Captain Archibald Gillespie to march north to meet him. In the ensuing Battle of San Pasqual , fought in the San Pasqual Valley which is now part of the city of San Diego, the Americans suffered their worst losses in the campaign. The Mexican negotiators of that treaty tried to retain San Diego as part of Mexico, but the Americans insisted that San Diego was "for every commercial purpose of nearly equal importance to us with that of San Francisco," and the Mexican-American border was eventually established to be one league south of the southernmost point of San Diego Bay , so as to include the entire bay within the United States. The state of California was admitted to the United States in . That same year San Diego was designated the seat of the newly established San Diego County and was incorporated as a city. Bean , the last alcalde of San Diego, was elected the first mayor. The location was not ideal, being several miles away from navigable water at its port at La Playa. In , William Heath Davis promoted a new development by the bay shore called "New San Diego", several miles south of the original settlement; however, for several decades the new development consisted only of a pier, a few houses and an Army depot for the support of Fort Yuma. After , the fort became supplied by sea and by steamboats on the Colorado River and the depot fell into disuse. Horton promoted the area heavily, and people and businesses began to relocate to New Town because its location on San Diego Bay was convenient to shipping. New Town soon eclipsed the original settlement, known to this day as Old Town , and became the economic and governmental heart of the city. The buildings were intended to be temporary structures, but most remained in continuous use until they progressively fell into disrepair. Over the next several decades the Army set up a series of coastal artillery batteries and named the area Fort Rosecrans. Navy presence began in with the establishment of the Navy Coaling Station in Point Loma, and expanded greatly during the s. The city was also an early center for aviation: Louis was built in San Diego in by Ryan Airlines. The plan was called " Operation Cherry Blossoms at Night " and called for kamikaze planes filled with fleas infected with plague *Yersinia pestis* to crash into civilian population centers in the city, hoping to spread plague in the city and effectively kill tens of thousands of civilians. The plan was scheduled to launch on September 22, , but was not carried out because Japan surrendered five weeks earlier. A large fishing fleet supported the canneries, mostly staffed by immigrant fishermen from Japan , and later from the Portuguese Azores and Italy whose influence is still felt in neighborhoods like Little Italy and Point Loma. The San Diego River runs through the

middle of San Diego from east to west, creating a river valley which serves to divide the city into northern and southern segments. During the historic period and presumably earlier as well, the river has shifted its flow back and forth between San Diego Bay and Mission Bay, and its fresh water was the focus of the earliest Spanish explorers. Mission Valley facing Northwest, taken from Arista Street. Mission Bay can be seen in the distance. The Cuyamaca Mountains and Laguna Mountains rise to the east of the city, and beyond the mountains are desert areas. Numerous farms are found in the valleys northeast and southeast of the city. Carmel Valley and Del Mar Heights occupy the northwest corner of the city. Point Loma occupies the peninsula across San Diego Bay from downtown. A narrow strip of land at the bottom of San Diego Bay connects these southern neighborhoods with the rest of the city. For the most part, San Diego neighborhood boundaries tend to be understood by its residents based on geographical boundaries like canyons and street patterns.

While the vast majority of Americans cohabitate in one way or another, there are also those who live alone – either by choice or by circumstance. Across the United States, about 1 in every 10 Americans – More than 1 in every 4 households – In some cities, however, living alone is far more common. According to estimates from the U. Census Bureau, there are 21 metropolitan areas where more than one in every three homes are occupied by individuals who live alone. While these cities do not necessarily share a single defining quality, there are some common characteristics that may help explain why residents are more likely to live on their own in these places. Living alone means footing the bill for utilities and rent – or upkeep and mortgage. For that reason, it is not financially prudent, or even possible, for many. In cities with a lower than average cost of living, fewer residents may need to rely on a roommate in order to afford housing. The Barnstable Town, Massachusetts metropolitan area, which comprises Cape Cod, is the only metro area where the most people live alone that has a higher than average cost of living. Not surprisingly, the cities with the most one-person households also tend to have large single populations. In the majority of cities with the largest share of people living alone, a smaller than average share of the population is married. Just as there are those for whom living alone is a choice, there are also those who are living alone due to circumstances outside of their control. Often, this means the passing of a spouse or family member. In 14 of the 21 cities where the most people live alone, a larger share of the 15 and older population is widowed than the 5. Many people live alone following the death of a spouse, particularly those older Americans who are less likely to remarry. The cities where more people are likely to live alone tend to have older populations compared to the U. Regardless of marital status or age, households in every city on this list are less likely than most to have children. Rebecca Abbott-Mccune was delivering water last week to residents in an apartment building in downtown Flint, Michigan. The resident was elderly, Black, blind, suspicious of strangers, and reluctant to let in volunteers in a city where the four-year water crisis has eroded public trust. A mechanical engineering sophomore at Kettering University, Abbott-Mccune said her experience in Flint was jarring. They live there because they have been displaced from their home because of the water crisis. And the problem is far from over. Subscribe to our daily or weekly digest. But not everyone in Flint has the filters attached correctly. Nor do they replace them as frequently as they should, volunteers told Rewire. One of the volunteers visiting the blind resident noticed that the filter attached to her kitchen tap was blinking red. Benjamin Pauli, social sciences professor at Kettering University, said he thinks the faucet filters solution was promoted largely for political reasons for the state to get out of the expense of providing residents with free bottled water. For this reason, the Genesee County Medical Society and Genesee County Health Department have recommended that children under 6, pregnant women, and immunocompromised residents continue to use bottled water. Residents may visit city help centers where the water is being delivered on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, from 10 a. These kinds of considerations are very salient in Flint, for good reason. Official numbers state that 12 died and 90 fell sick after exposure to the waterborne Legionella bacteria when the city drew its water from the polluted Flint River in and I regularly encounter a pervasive sense that little to nothing has been done, that residents are still not being heard, and that the crisis is far from over. The agency has taken steps to ensure compliance and intends to adopt all the recommendations, an EPA spokesperson told Rewire. She said she got involved with the Flint water crisis about two years ago when she interviewed Virginia Tech professor Marc Edwards for a documentary. His team studied the crisis and explained how the failure of the state to add anti-corrosive agents to the water caused the spike in Legionella cases in Genessee County in â€”a penny-pinching measure that was both predictable and preventable. City officials have never tested the water in her home, she said. Jones has filters on her shower head, bathroom, and kitchen taps. Many have blamed Gov. Snyder and his administration for causing the Flint crisis and several members of his administration are facing criminal charges or trials. A judge this month dropped Gov. The judge also dismissed race, civil rights, and negligence claims, according to the Associated Press. As Attorney General, Schuette signed off on the Flint water switch that put lead in our water and when problems came, he ignored 15 different complaints to his office over almost two years until the media exposed the scandal. Clean water is not listed as one of his campaign issues. However, he also rebuked Snyder for cutting off the bottled water supply in April, according to the Detroit Free Press.

Pre Edo period [ edit ] A painting depicting the Commodore Matthew Perry expedition and his first arrival in Japan in Tokyo was originally a small fishing village named Edo, in what was formerly part of the old Musashi Province. Edo was first fortified by the Edo clan , in the late twelfth century. During the subsequent Edo period , Edo grew into one of the largest cities in the world with a population topping one million by the 18th century. That was caused by the Meiji Restoration in During the Edo era, the city enjoyed a prolonged period of peace known as the Pax Tokugawa, and in the presence of such peace, Edo adopted a stringent policy of seclusion, which helped to perpetuate the lack of any serious military threat to the city. However, this prolonged period of seclusion came to an end with the arrival of American Commodore Matthew C. Commodore Perry negotiated the opening of the ports of Shimoda and Hakodate , leading to an increase in the demand for new foreign goods and subsequently a severe rise in inflation. Two-fifths of the city were completely burned, more than , buildings were demolished, , civilians were killed, and , more were injured. After the war, Tokyo was completely rebuilt and was showcased to the world during the Summer Olympics. The s brought new high-rise developments such as Sunshine 60 , a new and controversial [40] airport at Narita in some distance outside city limits , and a population increase to about 11 million in the metropolitan area. In the s, real estate prices skyrocketed during a real estate and debt bubble. The bubble burst in the early s, and many companies, banks, and individuals were caught with mortgage-backed debts while real estate was shrinking in value. Tokyo still sees new urban developments on large lots of less profitable land. Buildings of significance are demolished for more up-to-date shopping facilities such as Omotesando Hills. The most prominent is the Odaiba area, now a major shopping and entertainment center. Various plans have been proposed [43] for transferring national government functions from Tokyo to secondary capitals in other regions of Japan, in order to slow down rapid development in Tokyo and revitalize economically lagging areas of the country. These plans have been controversial [44] within Japan and have yet to be realized. Tokyo will be the first Asian city to host the Olympic Games twice.
