Most Haunted Places Situated overlooking what many people believe to be the most haunted city on Earth, Edinburgh Castle has been the site of torture and many bloody battles during its time. The house is known to be haunted by no less than 22 different spirits and apparitions ranging from young children, old ladies, and even a cat. Yet the most famous ghost comes in the form of Samuel Clemmons, known mostly as Mark Twain, who roams the bottom floors and basement of this building dressed head to toe in a white suit.

Oriental Theater This Chicago theater has had many namesâ€”Iroquois, Oriental, Fordâ€”but none have been able to erase the stain of tragedy from this place. Another 30 later died of their injuries. In the alley behind the theater, bodies were piled up, some of them after having leapt to their deaths from the fire escape. Today, the area is relatively quiet, but residents of the building behind the theater occasionally report feelings of uneasiness, as well as unexplained sounds they believe are tied to this disaster. Its design was based on the English Pentonville Prison, and it was built by convicts who were housed in ship hulks moored in Corio Bay. The gaol was operated as a high security prison until it was decommissioned in July, Little has changed at Geelong Gaol since its closure. Some exhibits of its past history have been added, in the style of a museum, but the gaol itself is still an imposing and dread-inspiring building. Prisoners were held in small, unheated cells, with no sewerage facilities at all, for up to fourteen hours each day. Past inmates have reported hearing female cries at night, especially in the east wing, the site of the Industrial School for Girls for the late s. Tour guides have reported witnessing several occurrences, including swirling mists, general weird feelings and people being struck. The site has been visited by various paranormal research teams, who have reported strange mists, sounds, EMF disturbances and orbs. The old infirmary, cell 45, the gallows, and the external shower block are reportedly the sites with the most activity. The gaol is now operated by the Rotary Club of Geelong, who run guided tours on weekends and holidays. Ghost tours run at night every weekend, and it has become a place that many claim is haunted by its own dark past. Those that were infected stayed behind in isolation. The location is now a popular tourist destination, running daily tours to people interested in learning about the history and the legends associated with the close.
