Simon Clark supplied the Foreword. Published by Rainstorm Press, Mutation Nation: The trade paperback featured twenty-six stories and poems by Bruce Boston, Geoffrey A. Dorr, Marge Simon and others, including the editor. Dorr, Lee Forsythe and other writers living in the south-western state.
