What makes up a catkin Package? For a package to be considered a catkin package it must meet a few requirements: The package must contain a catkin compliant package. The package must contain a CMakeLists. If it is a catkin metapackage it must have the relevant boilerplate CMakeLists. Each package must have its own folder This means no nested packages nor multiple packages sharing the same directory. The simplest possible package might have a structure which looks like this: A trivial workspace might look like this: First change to the source space directory of the catkin workspace you created in the Creating a Workspace for catkin tutorial: Building a catkin workspace and sourcing the setup file Now you need to build the packages in the catkin workspace: To add the workspace to your ROS environment you need to source the generated setup file: These first-order dependencies can now be reviewed with the rospack tool. These dependencies for a package are stored in the package. For instance, rospy has other dependencies. Luckily rospack can recursively determine all nested dependencies. Now lets go through the new package. If it is hard to describe the package in a single sentence then it might need to be broken up. At least one maintainer is required, but you can have many if you like. The name of the maintainer goes into the body of the tag, but there is also an email attribute that should be filled out: You can read about several of these at the Open Source Initiative.
