This great country has been around for almost 1, years and has had influences before that, all helping to make rich and vibrant celebrations that many enjoy every year. At this time, Big Ben rings in the new year. Many people celebrate by either having parties at home, or by going out and partying with friends. Many people also make new years resolutions as is customary in many other countries in the world. This is known as "First Footing," and the friend that enters usually gives a small ceremonial gift. Twelfth Night and Epiphany - January 5 - 6 It is considered bad luck to have Christmas celebration up past the day of Epiphany, so many people used January 5 Twelfth Night to take them down. Some people host parties and serve Twelfth Night cakes which have had one dried pea and one dried bean baked into them. If you are the one of the lucky party-goers who receive one of the other in their slice of cake, you will be crowned "king" or "queen" of the evening. Epiphany is a Christian holiday which celebrates the coming of the Magi after the birth of Christ. Some people attend a church service on this day. He is best known for writing the song, "Auld Lang Syne. Candlemas Day - February 2 This day marks the middle of the winter season - from the shortest day of the year to the Spring Equinox. This day also celebrates the cleansing of Mary. Many couples will spend the evening celebrating with a special meal. Occasionally, children will send valentines to one another in celebration. Purim varies Purim is a Jewish holiday that is celebrated on the 14th day of Adar a month of the Jewish calendar. This is the traditional day where Queen Esther saved the Jews from the decree of death in Babylon. Many gather together to read the story of the queen. Many will attend church services held in his honor. Some communities also hold "pancake races" in which people run a distance while flipping pancakes in a frying pan. In order to win, a person must cross the finish line without burning breakfast. Many people give up something they enjoy during lent. Two small pouches are given out. This day is also celebrated by the giving of eggs, decorating eggs and Easter egg hunts, where eggs are hidden for children and playful adults to find. George who is said to have defeated a dragon. The day is celebrated with parades and parties and flags with "St. May Day - May 1 This day is celebrated beautifully with may poles and flowers. It is traditionally a celebration of spring and fertility. Trooping the Colour Trooping the Colours - Sometime in June Trooping the Colours is celebrated every year with the British Army and the regiments of the Commonwealth performing a ceremony that originated in the seventeenth century AD. Swan Upping - Third Week of July Many celebrate this day by going to the River Thames and watching a procession of swans and traditional boats. Notting Hill Carnival - Last Monday in August On this day, there is a street festival that millions go to see and participate in every year. The parade include colorful floats, bands and many other attractions. Halloween - October 31 A day where people dress up, bob for apples and have bonfires. Many attend themed parties and children will occasionally go trick-or-treating though this traditions was started elsewhere, despite halloween having British origins. Bonfire Night Guy Fawkes Day - November 5 This day is in celebration of the failed gunpowder attempt to blow up the house of Parliament in It is celebrated with fireworks at night. Many families will make effigies of Guy Fawkes and burn them in a bon fire either in their own back yards or with other members of the community. Since the day is so close to Halloween, many will combine the two holidays maybe that is why there are so many Guy Fawkes masks available. Many people wear a poppy in their pocket in remembrance. Many Scots celebrate with special dances and festivals and the Scottish flag is flown throughout the country. On this day, Muslims celebrate the birth of their prophet Muhammad. Many use the day to remember the prophet and reflect on stories about his life. Some will even fast during the day. Christmas - December 25 This day is celebrated by friends and family by giving gifts and going to a special Sunday service at church. Many celebrate the tradition of "Father Christmas" by giving gifts that he delivered during the night. Many families also share in a Christmas feast that may involve ham, minced pies and Yorkshire pudding! At the beginning of the meal, each member of the family will cross arms and together pull

Christmas poppers that will produce paper hats worn through the meal as well as other trinkets and jokes.

Following are the most important religious days in Islam: This is the main day of weekly religious service in Islam. Mosques are usually filled to capacity with worshippers on this day. Worship service which consists of sermon and congregational prayer is held around noon time. In most Muslim countries Friday is also a weekly holiday. Government offices and schools are closed on this day. Muslims respect Friday because, according to Islamic tradition, it was the first day of creation when God created the heavens and earth. It is also believed to be the day when the resurrection will take place and so it will be the Day of Judgment. Muslims believe that Friday has a special cosmic significance and it is a very blessed day of the week. Ramadan is the ninth month of Islamic lunar calendar. Muslims consider this whole month a blessed month. They fast during the days of this month and make special prayers at night. People also give more charity and do extra righteous deeds. During the month of Ramadan, Prophet Muhammad received the first revelation. The angel Gabriel came to him while he was in the cave of Hira, near Makkah, and told him that God had appointed Muhammad as His last Messenger and Prophet. Muhammad began his prophetic mission from that time and started preaching the divine message that continued coming to him at different intervals during the rest of his life for 23 years. Ramadan is thus the month of celebration as well as the month of discipline and self control. This is a special night of the month of Ramadan. The Night of Qadr is better than one thousand months. The whole night is blessed, it is full of peace and angelic presence. Although it is not told exactly which night of the month of Ramadan is the Night of Qadr, Muslim make special prayers in the last ten nights of the month of Ramadan, hoping that one of it is the blessed Night of Qadr. Popularly the night of the 27th of Ramadan is celebrated with special prayers and vigils. Eid-ul-Fitr 1st of Shawwal, 10th month: At the conclusion of the month of Ramadan, on the first day of the 10th month of Islamic lunar calendar occurs Eid-ul-Fitr. This is one of two main festivals of Islam and is celebrated by all Muslims throughout the world The ceremony of Eid-ul-Fitr starts early morning with a worship service. This service is generally held in a large open place and is attended by thousands of Muslims. After the prayer the leader of the prayer Imam delivers a short sermon and then people greet each other. The rest of the ceremonies are held generally privately with families and friends. The significance of Eid is that it is a day of thanksgiving to Allah that He gave the opportunity to Muslims to benefit from and enjoy the blessings of the month of Ramadan. The Day of Hajj 9th of Dhul Hijjah, 12th month: Pilgrimage Hajj is one of the five pillars of Islam. The Hajj takes about five days, beginning from the eighth day until the twelfth. The twelfth month of Islamic year is named after Hajj and is called Dhul Hijjah. The main day of Hajj is the 9th day of Dhul Hijjah. It is an optional fasting and is considered very meritorious. Eid-ul-Adha from 10 12 of Dhul Hijjah, 12th month: Following the day of Hajj comes Eid-ul-Adha. It begins from the 10th day of the 12th month of the Islamic lunar calendar. This is the second main annual festival in Islam. On this day also exactly like the previous celebration, festivities begin with a prayer service held in an open place in the morning of the first day. This prayer is attended by a large number of Muslims. Since this festival occurs immediately after the Day of Pilgrimage those who go to make pilgrimage celebrate it in Mina, near Makkah. Other Muslims around the world also join with the pilgrims in their joy and thanksgiving. Another significance of Idul Adha is that it is a time of sacrifice. Since God gave Prophet Abraham peace be upon him a lamb to sacrifice instead of sacrificing his only son, Muslims also offer the sacrifices of animals. The sacrifice can be done after the prayer on the 10th until the 12th before sunset. Often people cook this meat during the holidays, make feasts and enjoy the celebration. The above days are universally recognized by all Muslims. There are some other important days that are often celebrated by Muslims with varying degrees of enthusiasm and devotion. Some Muslims do not consider them as religious holidays at all. New Year Day First day of Muharram, 1st month: However, due to the association of Islamic calendar with Hijrah, new year day becomes an important day to remember the meaning and significance of Hijrah. In modern times, some

Muslims also began using it to send greeting cards and celebrate new year. There are, however, no religious services associated with this day. Ashura 10th of Muharram, 1st month: After his arrival in Madinah in the year , Prophet Muhammad ﷺ peace be upon him instituted fasting on the 10th of Muharram. A year later this fasting was replaced with the mandatory fasting in the month of Ramadan. Many Muslims usually fast on this day also. October 10, C. It is a day of sadness for all Muslims. This day is remembered as the Birthday of the Prophet peace be upon him. It is a very popular day of celebration. It, probably, began early in the Fatimid Egypt beginning of tenth century C. There are no special prayers or religious services associated with this day, but many Muslims use this day to talk about the Prophet, his life and example. They use it as a time to express their love and devotion for Prophet Muhammad. It is now celebrated with varying degrees of enthusiasm throughout the Muslim world and wherever Muslims live. Night journey of the Prophet Muhammad peace be upon him from Makkah to Jerusalem and then his ascension to Heavens occurred in the year C. The Hadith literature gives much more details of this experience of the Prophet. Muslims remember this day as a day of great miracle and honor of the Prophet. On the eve of the 27th of Rajab, gatherings are held in the mosques and homes to remember the event and the whole story is told in poetry, chants or lectures. Sweets are distributed and great happiness and joy is expressed. There are also no special prayers associated with this night. Muslims remember this day with varying degrees of enthusiasm and devotion. Some people do not celebrate it at all. There are all kinds of legends associated with this night. In some countries it is celebrated with firework. There are no authentic ahadith about this night. He used to visit the Cemetery of Muslims and pray for those who passed away and used to fast the following day. The cumulative effect of these ahadith make them acceptable to some. On the basis of these reports some consider fasting on this day a blessed act. Again, this night and its following day are not universally accepted by all Muslims.

It is the most important night in Islam. Surat Al-Qadr describes its importance. Laylat al Raghhaib It is the first Friday night of month Rajab. It is known as Shab-e-barat as well. Salah daily prayers became mandatory after this journey. Alvida Jumma It is the last Friday in Ramadan. Every Friday is a mubarak blessed day for Muslims including the last Friday of Ramadan. Going to mazaar graveyards is a Sunnah. The intention must be to remind ourselves death and Akhirah afterlife. Quran can be read for the deceased. You can also pray for the deceased. It is the celebration of birthday of Prophet Muhammad.
