

Chapter 1 : Figurative Language - Examples and Definition

English Language Learners Definition of example: a person or way of behaving that is seen as a model that should be followed: someone or something that is mentioned to help explain what you are saying or to show that a general statement is true.

The word She that replaces name is called pronoun. There are hundreds of pronouns! Below are some examples. Verb Every day we do something. In addition, many things happen to us. Teachers punish us for not writing homework or Mamma beats us with a stick for fighting with our siblings. These words are called verbs. Thus a verb is a part of speech that indicates action. A verb has 4 forms: Now let us understand these forms. Thus an adjective is a part of speech that provides information modifies about a noun or pronoun. We have read that a verb has four forms, right? Do you know how many forms does an adjective has? These are called degrees of comparison. Now let us try to understand these concepts with examples. Adverb Now we have understood that the words that we use to describe a person are called adjective. What if we use those words to describe his action? She is a good girl. Here good is adjective. But when we say She sings well. The information is about her action or verb. Thus well here acts as an adverb. Again sometimes we call someone very good. An adverb can add to the information of adverb as well! Thus a sentence can have two adverbs with each other. However very is adding to the meaning of well. Thus it is also an adverb. So, an adverb is a part of speech that adds to the meaning of a verb, an adjective or another adverb. So the Preposition is a part of speech that indicates location. It links a noun or pronoun to the other words of the sentence. Conjunction Simply conjunctions are the words that join words or phrases or even sentences. A conjunction is also known as a joiner. A conjunction can be of three types Coordinating Conjunctions, Subordinating Conjunctions and Correlative Conjunctions. We will discuss these types later on. As the name suggests, a linking verb is a kind of verb that links a subject to the complement. A complement is the part of a sentence which modifies or provides more information about the subject. Examples of linking verbs are: However, just like some people, certain verbs also have dual personalities. Take a look at the two sentences below: Irine tasted the exotic food. The exotic food tasted great! In the first sentence, you can easily say that the italicized word is an action word done by Irine. However, in the second sentence, the same word has a different function. It serves as a linking verb that connects exotic food with the word, great. What are Multi-Part Verbs? Do not assume that verbs are limited to a single word. Sometimes, they come in two to four words. The basic formula for verbs with multiple parts is: Take a look at the examples below: I was given a two-week notice by the sales agent. The sentence above is written in the passive voice. Was is the auxiliary verb and given is the main verb. It must have been raining very hard. The main verb is raining and the auxiliary verbs are must have been. What are the Different Forms of Verbs? In order to be able to construct a grammatically correct sentence, it is very important that you know how to write in the proper verb tense. The three basic forms of verbs are past, present, and future. The first one obviously refers to an action that was already done, the second is for present action, and the third is for an action that will be done.

These are the types of questions this theme of geography deals with. They also study the lasting affects these interactions may have on a place. Some examples of this geography theme are damming a river, polluting the air, building highways or railroads, and even watering lawns and gardens. Human behavior such as planting trees is a positive interaction with the environment where creating landfills is a negative interaction. Movement also deals with how and why people travel from one place to another. Some people travel for career, others to be close to family, and some move to escape war or religious persecution. One example of movement was pioneers heading West on the Oregon Trail in hopes of finding cheap, fertile land in Oregon. Geographers also study how products and resources are transported from one region or place to another. This includes manufactured products, crops, and oil. For example, a tractor-trailer delivering oranges from Florida to New York, or a boat delivering a shipment of coffee from Africa to Europe. In addition, movement of ideas is also studied. With the advent of technology such as the phone and internet, ideas such as fashion, fads, music and philosophical ideologies are exchanged rapidly from all areas of the globe. Languages also evolve and change based on influence from outside ideas and other languages. These characteristics may be human, physical, or cultural. Not only do geographers study characteristics, but they also study how regions around the world may change over time. Different types of physical regions are deserts, mountains, grasslands, and rain forests. In a city or town, there may be commercial or business regions and then residential regions. For example, in the United States, we commonly identify the South as a region. Those states that are located in the south-eastern part of the United States have similar climates and grow similar crops, in addition many people who live there have a "southern" accent. These are characteristics that help unify this area of land that is considered a region.

Function of Figurative Language The primary function of figurative language is to force readers to imagine what a writer wants to express. Figurative language is not meant to convey literal meanings, and often it compares one concept with another in order to make the first concept easier to understand. However, it links the two ideas or concepts with the goal of influencing the audience to understand the link, even if it does not exist. Poets and prose writers use this technique to bring out emotions and help their readers form images in their minds. Thus, figurative language is a useful way of conveying an idea that readers cannot understand otherwise, due to its complex and abstract nature. In addition, it helps in analyzing a literary text.
