Tyler County vital records can be found at the West Virginia Office of Vital Records which has copies of birth and death records from January to present; marriage records from to present and divorce records from to present. There is a fee for each copy requested.

Stealey, and they had one daughter, Eliza J. Stealey was a daughter of O. December 27, , in this county were recorded the marriage vows of George M. Baker and Matilda Henthorn, and their son, James A. Matilda, wife of Mr. Her mother, born in Pennsylvania, January 29, , is now living in tyler county, and her father, born in Ohio, October 1, , died in the State and count of her birth. At Spottsylvania, he was severely wounded in the left shoulder and the ball remains in the right shoulder, giving him great trouble at times, and unfitting him for hard work. It was eighteen days after he was wounded before the wound was properly dressed. Baker has been a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church about sixteen years and his wife for two years. They were members of the 7th Virginia Infantry and all were wounded in the service, James and Clayton at Antietam, and George at Spottsylvania. A brother-in-law, John Garrison, was in the same war. Hissam, born September 11, In the home their marriage established are four children: The ancestors of Mr. Brown were of English birth. His mother, born November 29, , died February 20, Levi and Elizabeth Morgan Hissam, the parents of Mrs. Brown, now live in Campbell County, Kentucky. Her grandfather, John G. Morgan, was born in Monongalia County, Virginia, November 6, , is still living and a most remarkable instance of longevity. He has never been sick, and the only dose of medicine he ever took was one administered to him against his will in the war. Jesse Hissem, paternal grandfather of Mrs. Brown, was one of the pioneer settlers in this county, coming with his family from Pennsylvania. Brown has been living in the village of Shiloh since He is a manufacturer of woolen goods, and has been connected with the woolen factory here since it started. He came to America in , and in the same summer helped to build the first railroad bridge in America. He often saw "Old Hickory" in those days. He helped to build the bridge at the Relay House across the Patapsco, which has eight arches, and is the largest stone work in America. He built railroad bridges through Indiana, and superintended such work, at Flint Creek, Bartholomew county. In Baltimore, Maryland, in , Sarah Stevens became his wife. Since they made their home in Tyler county, Mr. Burns has done nearly all the mason work of the county, and has cleared his farm. He has now quit any work but looking after his farm, and is resting from the labors of a well-spent life. He was a Federal soldier during the war between the States and was twice married, and departed this life on the 19th of August His first wife was Eliza Hollcroff, of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania. was born in Tyler county, December 18, , and she died September 20, . She was a daughter of Levi and Barbara Nicely Grimm. Her parents were from Pennsylvania, and her father died in Tyler county, where her mother continues to reside. Cooper, for whom this sketch was compiled, is one of the most successful teachers of Tyler county, and is one of its rising young men. His post office address is Bearsville, Tyler county, West Virginia. This lodge was instituted February 7, , with the following officers: Stocking, treasurer; James L. Gillespie, secretary; Frank E. Their son, Benjamin, was here born, June 22, , and his life to the present time has been spent in this county. The latter place was his home for several years, at the end of which time he removed to the farm in Tyler county, where he remained until death. The subject of our sketch lived in Pennsylvania until he reached his majority. He was educated in the pioneer school-houses, and in united his fortunes for life to Miss Amy Hartley, daughter of Peter and Lydia Hartley. Her father was also an early settler of Tyler county, and was drafted as a soldier in , but the war closed before he saw any active service. The marriage of our subject proved a happy one, and he became the father of the following children: Laura, Lydia, Benjamin, Peter H. The mother of these children was born in Greensboro, Penn. Engle and wife hold membership in the Methodist Episcopal church. At the date last mentioned, Mr. Engle was elected to succeed him as clerk of the circuit court. He has been re-elected continuously ever since. These facts of themselves would be sufficient of themselves to indicate that Mr. Engle enjoys the confidence of the substantial yeomanry of Tyler county, and it gives us pleasure to add that, both as an official and a citizen, he ranks among the best in all walks of life [G. He came to Tyler county, in April , and has lived in the county since that date, following the avocations of an agricultural life, and making his home in Meade district. In the years of the civil war he was a soldier in Company H, 1st West Virginia Infantry, from October 25, , until November 25, , and he was engaged in the following battles: In Tyler county, February 22, , John W. Garrison and Emeline Baker were united in marriage, and they have three living children, while death has taken one from them. Her mother died at Sistersville, this county, February 15, , and her father died in this county, at Middlebourne, February 22, . The father of Mr. Garrison died in Tyler county, March, , and his mother now makes her home in Marietta, Ohio. The mother died May 6, , and the father on the 12th of August, Absalom George was born in Tyler county, June 3, , and in his boyhood was trained in the hard school of the frontier experiences of which mention is so often made in this volume.

Chapter 2 : West Virginia Marriage Records

This database contains an index extracted from West Virginia marriage records. What's in the Index. Beginning in Virginia law (which still applied to counties that would make up West Virginia) required counties to issue marriage licenses and record marriages in registers.

It indexes selected information found in a variety of collections and sources at the Library of Virginia. The card index files were originally organized by county. The number of entries listed under each county varies greatly, with the following counties having the largest indexes: There are also indexes for the following counties: Because these indexes were compiled by different people using different sources, the dates covered and the amount of information vary with each county. In addition, this index does not exhaust all available sources for the counties, nor is it a comprehensive index to Virginia marriages. Some obvious errors have been corrected in the transition from card index file to database, but researchers should use caution in accepting the information in the index as accurate without consulting the original source material. Original sources were not referenced in the creation of the database from the card files. Search Tips Searching by county displays a listing for all entries from that particular county. Search by Bride or Groom Name: Name searches may be performed by using a first or last name only or a combination of the two. Searches may be performed by using a single letter in the first name field and a full or partial name in the last name field. This search displays a list of all the marriages from this database indicated to have taken place between free people of color. Record-keeping practices prior to emancipation frequently included the use of the notation "Free Negro" to indicate a record or event concerning a free person of color, whose legal rights and responsibilities differed from those of enslaved people. Due to the difficulty of tracing African Americans prior to , most of whom were enslaved, indexers felt compelled to include this information in their indexes. The keyword search looks across all name fields and the notes field. Search results can be quite numerous, particularly if common words are used as search terms for example: Mary, John, or County. This search seeks only words that are directly next to each other, so use as few search terms as possible for best results for example: Mary Smith, spinster, of New Kent County. The dates listed in the marriage card files are not necessarily marriage dates. The date given could refer to the date of a marriage bond, to the date that an announcement of the marriage was published in a newspaper, or to some other date. Researchers must consult the source listed for an entry to determine what the date indicates. Notes Field in Database: Clarifying information is also present in the notes field, for example, to explain a particular date or spelling of a name. This information varies widely, with some entries providing no additional information. The notes field is searchable only by using the keyword search function. The source from which a particular entry in the index was taken is noted in full in the source field. Entries for which no source could be determined are noted as such in the source field.
