

Chapter 1 : Famous Hypocrites?

Jan 09, Â. The Rev. Marvin Gorman was many things to many people: a charismatic televangelist, a spiritual guide and a prolific author. But to his rival, the pioneering Rev. Jimmy Swaggart, Gorman was a.

October, â€”Powerful televangelist and right wing culture warrior Jimmy Swaggart is caught on camera in the company of known prostitute Debra Murphree at a dilapidated brothel motel in the New Orleans suburb of Metairie, Louisiana. Swaggart is delayed at the scene of the tryst by a staged flat tire. For you will hate one and love the other; you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money. According to Gorman on December 28, Lynda Savage called him at his office. Alone at a local motel she said she was severely depressed. Reverend Gorman dropped everything and rushed to her side. At the motel he found the door unlocked and, upon entry into the room, Mrs. Savage draped in a robe and sitting on the bed. An open bottle of pills was on the nightstand. Afraid that she had taken the pills he rushed over to the bed and sat down with her. That was when, he said, Mrs. Savage let the robe drop. They embraced and began to kiss. He unzipped his pants and attempted intercourse but was overcome by guilt and remorse. He stood up and composed himself. After apologizing to her profusely, Gorman told her that what they were doing was wrong, that he had to leave. According to her, she and Gorman had sex between eight and nine times during an affair that lasted two years. Savage claimed that the affair began during a counseling session when he diagnosed her with Anorgasmia the inability for a woman to have an orgasm. He told her that he could show her how to achieve one. Savage said she was the one who ended the affair because of conscience pangs and that Gorman tried on several occasions to reignite it. As for threatening suicide, Savage denied it. Due to his good looks, impressive stature and genuine love of people and a willingness to meet them where they stood in life, as well as his tolerance of, and outreach to, lapsed Catholics the First Assemblies of God congregation in New Orleans that he pastored had grown from little more than members to a jaw dropping 6, strong. Not only that, Gorman had been elected to the national Executive Board of the Assemblies of God where he had a hand in the doctrinal and disciplinary matters within the denomination; and, perhaps most significantly, he was in the process of finalizing the purchase of two television stations with satellites. Additionally, he was about to break ground on a new building project only a few blocks away from his current church site. Just 80 miles north of New Orleans, Baton Rouge was the bastion of the Assemblies of God denomination and the home of its famous firebrand televangelist Jimmy Swaggart whose television show A Study in the Word was broadcast to over 3, stations at the time. Jimmy Swaggart buttered his bread with a more traditional, fundamentalist Pentecostalism. He forbade dancing of any kind, even aerobics, and demanded that women be subservient to their husbands. He was particularly strict on sexual matters going so far to denounce oral sex between a husband and wife as perverted and berating young men and women for masturbating. He would contort his face to demonstrate the horror and vileness of sin. He whooped and hollered. A tall, broad shouldered man, he lunged and swung at the demons of the air. He pleaded and cajoled. He captivated and entertained. And the money poured in. Jim Bakker, on the other hand, was softerâ€”in every sense of the word. God wants you to be happy. God wants you to be successful. God wants you to be rich. And it was successful. He took the call. Gorman hung up and went about his day as usual, noting that whatever it was that Savage wanted, it seemed a little urgent. He knew Savage well, having mentored him in the ministry. As soon as Savage entered the room Gorman sensed something was wrong. Instead he turned and faced Gorman, looking him dead in the eyes. It was July 15, And as hot as it was, things were about to get even hotter.

Seven times, he abruptly breaks into tears. And he lays hands on a partially paralyzed young man. Outside, the plus flagpoles that once carried the banners of every country where his sermons were broadcast stand unused. Decorating the stadium-sized, mostly vacant parking lot at the worship center are signs for a shuttle bus that long ago stopped running. But Swaggart still preaches the same message from the same place, his acre complex in Baton Rouge, La. His only public concession to falling popularity is his use of public-access channels More popular cable outlets largely shun him to broadcast his message to TV markets at odd hours. He remains, he says, an "old-fashioned, Holy Ghost-filled, shouting, weeping, soul-winning, Gospel-preaching preacher. And he still lives in the same gated mansion. Marvin Gorman, has re-emerged, driving a Toyota, doing tent revivals and generally providing a humbler contrast. Pride goes before destruction and the haughty spirit before the fall. And that crept into each one of us. But his sermon offers a reply to his critics. God, he says, has spoken repeatedly to him since he was 8 years old. The Lord instructed him to begin a TV ministry in His autobiography proclaimed, "There are no skeletons in the Swaggart closet," but recounted a warning from a longtime friend. It goes to their head. Frisbee was a key figure in the Jesus Movement and was involved in the rise of two worldwide denominations Calvary Chapel and the Vineyard Movement. Both churches later disowned him because of his active homosexuality, removing him first from leadership positions, then ultimately firing him. He eventually died from AIDS in Marjoe Gortner, early s Main article: Marjoe Gortner Gortner rose to fame in the late s as a child preacher, but he had simply been trained to do this by his parents and he had no personal faith. He was able to perform "miracles" and received large amounts of money in donations. After suffering a crisis of conscience, he invited a film crew to accompany him on a final preaching tour. Billy James Hargis Hargis was a prolific author and radio evangelist. Hargis formed American Christian College in to teach fundamentalist Christian principles. However, a sex scandal erupted at the College, involving claims that Hargis had sex with male and female students. The college eventually closed down in the mids. Hargis denied the allegations publicly. When asked why she was with Swaggart, she replied, "He asked me for sex. Morris Cerullo A number of incidents involving California-based televangelist Morris Cerullo caused outrage in the United Kingdom during the s. At a London crusade in , he pronounced a child cancer sufferer to be healed, yet the girl died two months later. Cerullo also produced fund-raising material which was condemned as unethical by a number of religious leaders, as it implied that giving money to his organisation would result in family members becoming Christians. Mike Warnke Warnke was a popular Christian evangelist and comedian during the s and s. He claimed in his autobiography, *The Satan Seller* , that he had once been deeply involved in a Satanic cult and was a Satanic priest before converting to Christianity. Its investigation turned up damaging evidence of fraud and deceit. Most critically, however, the investigation showed how Warnke could not possibly have done the many things he claimed to have done throughout his nine-month tenure as a Satanist, much less become a drug-addicted dealer or become a Satanic high priest. Robert Tilton, Main article: Robert Tilton Tilton is an American televangelist who achieved notoriety in the s and early s through his paid television program *Success-N-Life*. At its peak, it aired in all American TV markets. Grant, and Main article: He was then imprisoned for tax evasion in After restarting his ministry upon release, a TV investigation found that claims of healing he made at a revival in Atlanta were false. Bob Moorehead, Main article: Bob Moorehead Moorehead, pastor of the Overlake Christian Church from the s to June, was arrested in July, on a charge of indecent exposure in a public restroom in Daytona Beach, Florida. He stepped down amid allegations of molestation of adult members during baptism and wedding ceremonies that went as far back as 20 years earlier. Roy Clements Clements was a prominent figure within British evangelical christianity. In , he revealed he was in a homosexual relationship with another man, resigned his pastarship, and separated from his wife. He had written a number of well-received books which were withdrawn from sale when the news broke. His claimed shedding of homosexuality is also the subject of his autobiography *Not Afraid to Change*. In September , Paulk was found and photographed in a Washington, D. Later questioned by gay rights activist Wayne Besen , Paulk denied being in the bar despite photographic proof to the contrary. James Dobson sided with Paulk and supported his claims. Subsequently, Paulk, who himself had written about his habit of lying while he openly lived as a homosexual, confessed to being in the bar, but claimed he entered the establishment for reasons other than sexual pursuits. Paulk retained his Board seat for Exodus, however he did so while on

probation. Paulk did not run again for chairman of the board of Exodus when his term expired. Joe Barron, Joe Barron, one of the 40 ministers at Prestonwood Baptist Church , one of the largest churches in the United States with 26, members, was arrested on May 15, for solicitation of a minor after driving from the Dallas area to Bryan, Texas , in order to allegedly engage in sexual relations with what he thought to be a 13 year-old girl he had met online. Bentley claimed that tens of thousands of people were healed at the revival. However, in August , he stepped down permanently when it was revealed he was separating from his wife, Shonnah, and was in a relationship with Jessa Hasbrook, a member of his staff. Chapter 5 : Forest rangers, fire crews brace for eclipse watchers to descend on U.S

Gorman called ministers, friends, and donors to write letters on behalf of Bakker for a sentence that better reflected his crimes. Even in the midst of the scandals, he worked tirelessly to help friends - even when he knew it could further mar his own reputation.

With his parents, Swaggart attended a small, member Assemblies of God church in Ferriday. In , aged 17, Swaggart married year-old Frances Anderson whom he met in church while he was playing music with his father. They have a son named Donnie. Swaggart worked several part-time odd jobs in order to support his young family and also began singing Southern Gospel music at various churches. Although the offer meant a promise for significant income for him and his family, Swaggart turned Phillips down, stating that he was called to preach the gospel. He began developing a revival-meeting following throughout the American South. In , he began recording gospel music record albums and transmitting on Christian radio stations. In , Swaggart was ordained by the Assemblies of God; a year later he began his radio ministry. In the late s, Swaggart founded what was then a small church named the Family Worship Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana ; the church eventually became district-affiliated with the Assemblies of God. The station broadcast Christian feature stories, preaching and teaching from various fundamentalist and Pentecostal denominations and played black gospel , Southern gospel , and inspirational music. As Contemporary Christian music became more prevalent, the station avoided playing it. Swaggart sold many of his radio stations gradually throughout the s and early s. Jimmy Swaggart Ministries still operates several radio stations that operate under the name Sonlife Radio. Prostitution scandals[edit] In , Swaggart was implicated in a sex scandal involving a prostitute that resulted initially in his suspension, and ultimately defrocking , by the Assemblies of God. Three years later Swaggart was implicated in another scandal involving a prostitute. Once exposed, Gorman was defrocked from the Assemblies of God, his ministry all but ended. When Swaggart arrived, he reportedly went into Room 7. They called Marvin Gorman, whose church was located nearby. Gorman arrived at the Travel Inn a short while later and asked Swaggart what he was doing there. Gorman waited almost a year, then hand-delivered a note to Swaggart informing him his time was up; Swaggart did not respond. Carlson summoned Hamill and Gorman to fly to Assemblies of God headquarters in Springfield, Missouri and arranged for an emergency meeting of the presbyters. This was done to establish that the room was being used for prostitution. One of the men seen leaving Room 7 was Swaggart. The presbytery leadership of the Assemblies of God decided that Swaggart should be suspended from broadcasting his television program for three months. Paul Levy, senior editor for the Enquirer, stated that the polygraph examiner had concluded Murphree was not truthful on six key questions, including one in which she was reportedly asked if she had fabricated the story. Levy stated that the Enquirer decided not to print her story due to the test results, her drug use, and the fact that she had arrest warrants in three states. Murphree failed questions about whether she was paid or promised money to "set up" Swaggart, and whether she made up the story in order to make money from it. The national presbytery of the Assemblies of God soon extended the suspension to their standard two-year suspension for sexual immorality. His return to the pulpit coincided with the end of a three-month suspension originally ordered by the Assemblies. Believing that Swaggart was not genuinely repentant in submitting to their authority, the hierarchy of the Assemblies of God immediately defrocked him, removing his credentials and ministerial license. He was pulled over by a police officer in Indio, California , for driving on the wrong side of the road. With him in the vehicle was a woman named Rosemary Garcia. According to Garcia, Swaggart had stopped to proposition her on the side of the road. She later told reporters, "He asked me for sex. His son Donnie preaches at Family Worship Center and also preaches in churches across America and abroad. Feb 25, Â· The Bakker Connection Among Gorman's few steadfast allies during Swaggart's attacks was Jim Bakker, who, in the months before the PTL scandal broke last March, took up Gorman's cause on "The Jim.

Gorman himself had been fired from the Assemblies of God ministry after Swaggart had reported that Gorman was having an adulterous affair. Gorman confronted Swaggart and told him he would have to come clean. Swaggart said he would but failed to do so. The Assemblies of God immediately imposed upon him the mandatory two-year rehabilitation time required of all its ministers who fall into sexual sin. This meant Swaggart could not minister in any capacity for two years, while undergoing treatment and counseling. Swaggart rejected this, though he had agreed this was a good policy for Gorman. On February 21 , , on his television show taped in Baton Rouge, Louisiana , Swaggart tearfully confessed that he was guilty of an unspecified sin and made comparisons to himself and King David. Because he would not submit to the authoritative discipline and rehabilitative policies of the Assemblies of God, his ordination was revoked. As a result, Swaggart spent a considerable amount of time, in church and on television, blasting the Assemblies of God for its "unforgiving" stances. Swaggart lost much of his audience after these events. Swaggart subsequently blamed his problems on " demons " and claimed that controversial evangelist Oral Roberts had "cast out the demons" over the phone, thus assuring Swaggart was now free of moral defect. There are erroneous reports of this hotel being in Lake Charles or Baton Rouge. On October 11 , , in Indio, California , police stopped Swaggart for driving on the wrong side of the road. With the addition of television as a means of delivery, the emphasis and interpretations of individual callings were modified due to the need to develop financial and audience support. Individual programs showed a wide range of formats, from televised preaching to talk shows. Television as a mass media tool was introduced in the s and, along with other electronic media, was used for evangelism and constituency building. By the s, there were 1, religious radio stations and more than religious television stations. Three Christian networks broadcast 24 hours a day to nationwide audiences. The Golden Age of televangelism, from approximately to , brought religious broadcasting to national attention. During this period, Nielson and Arbitron rating services measured audience size. According to the results of the rating services, Oral Roberts lost the number one position to Robert Schuller the Hour of Power and Jimmy Swaggart Ministries, who vied for the top rating. There were eight individual teleministries that began developing stable and large audiences and built complex organizations that became both part of the ministry and a rationale for viewer financial support. These organizations reflected different interests; however, the major televangelists had educational components, many of which continue to operate: These educational projects varied with the interests and the finances of the evangelist. Social and Structural Origins of Televangelism Televangelism is a hybrid institution derived from urban revivalism and television see Frankl, The true impact of urban revivalism on religious practice can best be seen in an examination of the legacies of three great urban revivalists: Charles Finney articulated the ethos of urban revivalism upon which contemporary televangelism is based. On Revivals of Religion explained to the clergy how to conduct revivals or, given the primary calling of the revivalists, how to win souls. Finney favored the direct biblical words rather than sophisticated theological doctrines, just as he favored the grammar and rhetoric of plain people. Lectures provided the ideological justification for making revivalism a planned event instead of a mystical, spirit-filled happening. Furthermore, Finney exhorted ministers to use "any means" to produce powerful excitement and to play an active role as an agent of God. Whereas Finney profoundly altered the ethos, preaching style, and content of revivalism, Dwight Moody rationalized and routinized the organization of revivalism and some of its rituals about 30 years later. Moody also contributed to the social milieu of revivalism through the creation of an infrastructure for Bible schools and institutes. These schools, in particular the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, continue to educate and train students to carry on the work of Moody and other revivalists. Largest Teleministries Starting in Akron, Ohio, Rex Humbard was one of the first evangelists to build a ministry that incorporated radio and television programming. He was aware of the effect his television ministry might have on local churches and worked together with local pastors to get recent converts involved in their local churches. The Humbard family no longer produces programs. Granville Oral Roberts made the transition from tent crusader as the "King of Faith Healers" into radio and television broadcasting. His radio audience was larger than any other faith healer. By , Roberts was the national leader of paid religious television. Frankl Roberts later closed the City of Faith, including the medical school. The law school and library holdings were donated to then CBN now Regent University when donations fell as a result of the televangelism scandals. Set apart from many fundamentalist revivalists by his tolerance for theological diversity, Roberts has been willing to work with a wide range of Christians, thus separating himself from doctrinaire fundamentalists. Harrell Roberts accepted biblical inerrancy as a living revelation perceived by experience; he believes in direct intervention of God see Miracle of Seed Faith , Revell Friends with Billy Graham who dedicated ORU in and Pat Robertson, he avoided involvement with the Moral Majority movement, eschewing the mixing of politics and religion. His upbeat message of hope was combined with promises of health, happiness, and prosperity. Schuller is the only televangelist from a mainline denomination. From the snack bar roof of the Orange drive-in theater, he conducted Sunday Services. During the s, Schuller vied with Oral Roberts for the position of most watched televangelist. It is also seen in 44 foreign countries by an estimated 20 million viewers of special foreign-language versions. As part of his ministry, he founded the Institute for Successful Church Leadership , which has more than 20, graduates; New Hope, a Christian hour counseling center ; and the International School of Christian Communication, specializing in the art of preaching. Schuller is the author of more than 30 books. From this church, Falwell broadcasts the Old-Time Gospel Hour , his television outreach program, and Listen America Radio , three minutes of radio news and commentary with conservative leaders addressing political issues. Falwell is the author of 12 books and founder of the Moral Majority , renamed Liberty Federation. The Moral Majority and the Christian Voice, both established in , were the principal umbrella organizations for the New Christian Right. The Moral Majority had "access to a national network of fundamentalists united by a common fellowship, a commitment to building great churches and Christian Schools" Liebman and Wuthnow Preaching to congregations across the nation and establishing lengthy mailing lists for direct mail campaigns, Falwell registered thousands of voters united by the Moral Majority against abortion, pornography, the ERA, homosexuality, and the decline of moral and familial values. Through lobbying and distributing mass petitions to bring attention to conservative positions, Falwell saw the Moral Majority "as a means to a much broader social movement" Hadden and Shupe The Christian Voice, although smaller than the Moral Majority, did campaign for conservative Christian viewpoints against homosexuality and pornography. The Religious Roundtable, formed in by Ed McAteer under the umbrella of Moral Majority and Christian Voice, provided a forum for conservative political discussions. Falwell was seen as a spokesperson for the Religious Roundtable, which in held a large conference in Dallas with New Christian Right leaders, televangelists, and Ronald Reagan in attendance. Roundtable forums urged audiences to lobby for conservative issues, such as supporting prayer in schools and the teaching of creationism, through mass mail campaigns to Congress. In , Falwell focused his message on the social and moral aspects of politics in his revivalist "I Love America" rallies held on steps of state capitol buildings across the nation. In his book Listen, America! After the elections, Falwell took credit for helping to elect President Reagan and conservative members of Congress. In , Falwell dissolved the Moral Majority and created the Liberty Federation, "a new political arm. The 2 to 3 million following was disproved; the claim that the Moral Majority was a large grassroots group and suggestions that it had a religiously diverse following were disproved as well. His Moral Majority members were mostly southern Baptists Wilcox Falwell started the Lynchburg Christian Academy in , with kindergarten through 12th grade. figure in the AOG as a political benefactor, generous financial contributor, and media star Poloma Swaggart lost considerable credibility among his followers when it was revealed in that he regularly visited a prostitute. Swaggart returned to his own pulpit as an independent minister, decreasing his airtime and emphasizing his international evangelical activities. Swaggart is the author of *Rape of the Nation*, published in Jimmy Swaggart Ministries, a treatise on what he saw as the moral decay of the United States. Jim Bakker did lend his name as a sponsor to the "One Nation Under God" rally in Washington, an ostensibly apolitical gathering that nonetheless had political pretensions Hadden and Swann In March, Bakker was accused of sexual misconduct with former church secretary Jessica Hahn and convicted in on federal wire and mail fraud charges in an attempt to finance Heritage USA, selling more time-shares in the hotel than were available to fund other building projects. He was subsequently defrocked by the Assemblies of God. His properties were taken in bankruptcy proceedings. While Jim was in prison, the Bakkers divorced and Tammy subsequently remarried. This scandal had major consequences for television ministries and televangelism. It led to a reduction in financial support for all televangelists and to major changes in televangelism as a whole. At the present time, Pat Robertson has become the preeminent televangelist by transforming his early radio and television network into a major, publicly traded cable and satellite network known primarily for the Family Channel, which is owned by International Family Entertainment, Inc. Televangelism Scandals of The scandals involving Jim and Tammy Bakker, Marvin Gorman, and Jimmy Swaggart have roots in pentecostalism, its interpretations among practitioners, and the competition brought about by the growth of teleministries. The Bakkers and Marvin Gorman represent a more modern interpretation of charisma that accommodates materialism, while Swaggart represents the traditional charisma that shuns modernism and self-aggrandizement at least for the laity. According to Poloma, the beginning of the fall of the televangelism stars in the Assemblies of God all of the above-mentioned ministers belong to the denomination came in when it was revealed by Swaggart that Marvin Gorman had been having extramarital affairs. Swaggart then turned his wrath on the Bakkers, whom he perceived to be his biggest rivals and who represented a threat in the form of "modernism. Bakker was brought down when it was revealed that he had an extramarital affair with a church secretary, Jessica Hahn although there were also financial mismanagement charges.

Chapter 8 : Swaggart-Damnation

When the PTL scandal destroyed fellow Assemblies of God minister Jim Bakker, Swaggart publicly denounced Bakker's scandal (not Bakker personally) as "a cancer on the body of Christ." Shortly afterward, Swaggart faced his own sex scandal when a private investigator, hired by a rival evangelist Marvin Gorman, documented a series of Swaggart's.

They need to be ashamed. They are false ministers. Know the Law Statutes and laws and rules govern society. To illustrate, parents have rules that govern their household. This is family government. And civil government regulates our communities and nation in the best interests of society. Unfortunately, overturning laws and statutes grounded in Scriptural law is destroying our nation. The point is that laws restraining license govern us because license results in social chaos. But modern society demands license instead of liberty. License is freedom from rules; it is abuse of freedom. And liberty is freedom to act within the law. Concerning Christianity, liberty is being made free from sin to serve Christ: But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life. In fact, Paul reproveth the Corinthians in his first letter in 6: Know ye not that we shall judge angels? Paul is reproveth the Corinthians for their lack of wisdom to judge small matters in the church. Saints shall judge the world! That is why we must be diligent students of the only authoritative law – the Bible. The Bible is authoritative law that governs the body of Christ. And in plain language, Paul declares the authority for judging and church discipline: But now I have written unto you not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat. For what have I to do to judge them also that are without? Do not ye judge them that are within? But them that are without God judgeth. Therefore put away from among yourselves that wicked person. God judges or disciplines them. But the sinful conduct of professing Christian brothers and sisters is within the authority and jurisdiction of the church. Specifically, Biblical law pronounces that unrepentant sinners in the congregation are to be disciplined by excommunication. Just as in the Old Testament, lepers were declared unclean and must be cast outside the camp; the New Testament declares sin is spiritual leprosy and the unclean must be cast outside the body of Christ. The unclean corrupt the body of Christ. Of course, this is contrary to the modern church that invites the unclean into the church body without repentance to increase church membership. And modern Christians are ignorant it is the calling of the evangelist to go out among the sinners and call them to repentance before welcoming them into the body of Christ. Wicked persons corrupt the body of Christ, therefore, Paul commands: So, does this apply to ministers? Of course it does! Jesus never instructed us to turn a blind eye to false prophets – false preachers. Ministers who preach the Gospel but live a wicked life are false preachers – false prophets! In fact, Jesus warns us in Matthew 7: Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Good fruit is holy and righteous living. Good fruit is not good works. Preaching and teaching the Word, singing gospel songs, writing religious books, broadcasting religious programs, and other good works are not evidence of a true preacher. And to make this very clear, Jesus continues: 21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. In plain language, Jesus warns that good works will not save us: We must live a righteous and holy life. And modern preachers like Swaggart falsely preach that the Message of the Cross is that we are under Grace without repentance: This is a lie! Listen to the Voice of the Lord: Ye shall know them by their fruits. All these things come from within, and defile the man. Those are not taught nor sent of the holy God, whose lives evidence that they are led by the unclean spirit. God puts the treasure into earthen vessels, but not into such corrupt vessels:

He started the engine and began backing out when he realized he had a flat tire. He pulled back in, in front of Room 6. As he changed the tire, Debra sat on the curb and watched her John. If he was stopped, it might go badly. As he worked, perspiring in his sweat suit and headband, she entreated him not to tell the cops anything. Across the highway was a billboard that showed an open Bible. In large letters was a verse from the gospel of John: Your eternity is at stake! Debra smirked, her eyes roving until they rested in the window of Room There, in the window, was a telephoto lens draped with a black cloth. She bolted back into her room and watched through a crack in the door as, only a moment later, a blue car pulled into the lot. He was a hysterical germaphobe, demanding, and judgmental. He barely tried to hide his identity – a sweatsuit and headband his only disguise. And so it took exceptionally little effort to photograph him and possess evidence of what was openly known by sex workers and law enforcement alike in the parish. Gorman wanted to let Jimmy know he had been caught. He wanted to give Jimmy the opportunity denied to so many others – the opportunity to repent and make things right. More, Gorman understood that the Assemblies of God was in the middle of an identity crisis. Whatever animosity existed within the denomination, Gorman felt, was because transitions were difficult. Christianity had suffered worse over centuries, and would certainly survive this decade. Patience was needed to weather the course. These men had been friends and shared many meals together, after all. They loved one another. Swaggart apologized, repented, asked Marvin to pray with him, and they left one another calm and confident that they could work all this out between them. Jimmy promised he would recant, admit to the lies he had told about Gorman and use his power within the denomination to restore the minister. The photographs were not a threat. There would be no more attacks. No, Gorman had the photographs taken because if Swaggart did not finally tell the truth to the denomination and, ultimately, the world about all the lies he had told about Gorman, then Gorman would move forward on exposing Swaggart. Gorman sat on the photos. He contacted Jimmy multiple times, asking whether he had confessed to the denomination. Gorman asked whether Jimmy had filmed an episode of his television or radio ministries admitting the lies he had told. Was he going to do any of the things he had promised? Finally, Gorman flew to Springfield, Missouri, and showed the executive leadership of the Assemblies what everyone in Louisiana already knew – Swaggart was a liar. Guilty of the very sins he had accused Gorman of committing. Unlike Swaggart, whose rumors and lies had no substance except for the one instance Gorman had already confessed to, Gorman had evidence – photographs. When the denominational leaders refused to discipline Swaggart, Gorman pursued justice by other means. He exposed Swaggart to the world. He sued Swaggart for defamation. And, in the end, he vindicated himself and all of the ministers Swaggart has denounced, derailed, defamed, and disgraced – Jim Bakker included. It had been such an empty victory. He had told the truth, but at what cost? The most well known ministries in the world had collapsed on themselves. Jim Bakker, humiliated and far outside of his realm of understanding, had been photographed in the middle of a mental breakdown walking out of a courtroom, tears streaming down his face, mouth agape in sobs. Bakker had been found guilty of financial mismanagement at PTL but, perhaps more importantly was seen as an example of how far away public ministries had gotten from the commands of Jesus in scripture. Swaggart had finally confessed, to an audience of millions, to an un-named sin and saw his ministry collapse underneath him as students left his Bible college in a mass exodus and donors immediately stopped sending money. One month after the verdict against him, Swaggart was found with yet another prostitute in Indio, California. But as Gorman left the courthouse that day, he was met by several newspaper reporters beneath a large oak tree in front of the court house on Loyola Avenue. He spoke of continuing his ministry and said he had no intention of leaving New Orleans. He was going to serve God. The reporters turned to the question of money – after all, each of the ministries scandalized that year had fallen because of money. Gorman was now being painted with the same brush. He answered that he had no idea if he, personally, would ever receive any money from the trial. It was

his goal, he said, to see his creditors paid. What he wanted was the satisfaction of justice, of revealing the truth and setting things right. As anyone who has been awarded a judgment in a civil case knows, having the judgment is one thing. In fact, he filed for bankruptcy and, exhausted, gave up pursuing the judgement in his favor. He spent the next decade traveling to the few churches across America who would still have him and eventually paid off creditors with his own money. His daughter, Beverly, married and became a singer with her husband, also a pastor in New Orleans. His youngest son, Mark, became a motivational speaker. The Gormans, so instrumental in changing the spiritual climate of New Orleans were forgotten. Twelve years after his resignation as pastor of the First Assembly of God of New Orleans, his confession of adultery, his loss of credentials from the Assemblies of God and ultimate bankruptcy, Marvin Gorman has returned to the basics of his original ministerial calling. He pastored a church called the Temple of Praise, housed in the same building on Elysian Fields Avenue where he first preached when he moved to New Orleans in . He settled into a quiet life, content to drive a Toyota Camry instead of his big Buick, and lost the desire to own a Lincoln or Cadillac. He and Virginia lived in a more modest home, enjoyed a less lavish lifestyle from that they had before. But he was no less charismatic, no less effective in the pulpit. On November 20, , the Times Picayune published an extensive story on him and the chronology of events surrounding his ordeal. It turned out to be a most positive front-page story for the Sunday Metro Section. At the Temple of Praise, Marvin preached to a congregation of all colors and nationalities. He has also begun a special Hispanic ministry by hiring a pastor who is affluent in Spanish to hold special services. Rising to ministry at a time of civil and racial intensity, he never stopped working for racial understanding and acceptance. As before, Gorman extended his ministry beyond the boundaries of The Temple of Praise. He went out into the street, seeking people in need of help, both spiritual and otherwise. There is no talk of satellite dishes or international church politics, no private jet, no deals with convicted criminals for millions of sequestered dollars. Marvin also points out, ironically, that when he dies, the obituary in the paper probably will not read that a man devoted to God and the children of God died, but that a man who fell from grace and was at the center of a religious scandal had finally passed on. Which is exactly what happened. Marvin Gorman died on 4 January, At that time, Tammy Faye was openly and publicly embracing homosexuals and demanding that be welcomed in Evangelical churches. Gorman, as he had done for years at First Assembly, implicitly showed where he stood on the matter by who he associated with. Gorman called ministers, friends, and donors to write letters on behalf of Bakker for a sentence that better reflected his crimes. Even in the midst of the scandals, he worked tirelessly to help friends “ even when he knew it could further mar his own reputation. Tammy Faye and her son, Jay, both supported gays in the Church when that debate was first starting to simmer in the Nineties. As Gorman had said decades previously, everyone “ especially sinners “ were welcome in the Church. You have to let God deal with them if [God] thinks it is a problem. What we need to do instead is share the Gospel and power of the Spirit. Even in the midst of a very public courtroom battle, Gorman maintained that theirs was a personal disagreement based on misinformation. In any event, Gorman refused to publicly denounce Swaggart outside of the matters before the Court. Gorman travelled to Africa regularly to hold conferences for pastors and, curiously, to advocate for thicker theology in support of the Pentecostal experience. In , Charisma Magazine released an article about a revival Gorman was a part of which, at the time, some felt was evidence that his ministry had finally been restored. There were a number of healings. After one service he began to feel sensation returning to the fingers of his left hand, which had been almost severed in a nasty barge accident more than 20 years ago. He also was freed from troubled dreams about the accident. I have never before in my life witnessed people so hungry after the things of God, people coming with such a high level of expectancy. Now 67, Gorman said he believes the move of God was the fulfillment of a promise that his latter days would be more fruitful than his former. My real burden is for leadership. I feel that He has brought me through enough that I can relate to any of their hurts or challenges. And the church will either fail or pass the test. They will forgive and love mercy or will continue to hold bitterness and judgmentalism. Shortly thereafter, Gorman was quietly reinstated as an Assemblies of God minister, the excommunication was lifted, and he was asked to teach at their seminaries. But Gorman, apart from the revivals which seemed to bloom wherever he went, had been no shrinking violet. Jerrell Miller of Remnant International claims that Gorman, who had already

established a respected annual school for pastors in Nigeria, began to experience miracles all around him that were worth noting.
