Contents [show] Function Shatterdomes are massive buildings designed or built to house over a dozen or more facilities and personnel directly dedicated to the repair and operations of the Jaegers. Shatterdomes provide housing and food for all personnel, including a place to hone their fighting skills and to determine drift capability, such as the Kwoon Combat Room. Located near major bodies of water, Shatterdomes have two major points of deployment for Jaegers; by sea or by air.
