Writing of the NBT is reserved for applicants to higher education institutions in South Africa. Teachers are not permitted to write the NBT with a view to preparing their learners for the tests. "Teaching to the test" limits real engagement with the topics that are being assessed.

What are the national benchmark tests? The results of the two sections of the test are recorded separately. The second test is Mathematics MAT , which is also multiple-choice and three hours in duration. CUT uses the NBT results in addition to school academic performance and examination results for placement in development courses, extended programmes, or for identifying other additional academic support. Applicants to the Faculty of Health and Environmental Sciences, the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology and some departments of the Faculty of Humanities should also have written the Mathematics test. Meeting Summary. Higher Education South Africa (HESA) briefed the Committee on results received from the National Benchmark Tests Project. The project was developed to demonstrate inefficiencies in Higher Education and to address concerns about how to interpret the new National Senior Certificate.

There are two tests. The test results will be used in addition to the Grade 11 results for early decision making purposes and the Grade 12 results for final decision-making purposes and other admission criteria. These are standard tests for all medical schools in South Africa and you are only required to write the tests once, irrespective of the number of medical schools you have applied to. Applicants must register on the NBT website, www.nbt.ac.za. Registration closes approximately three weeks prior to each of the test dates. You can register for the NBT even before you submit your application to the University. **DO NOT** wait for an official notification from the University in order to register and write the tests. You may miss the end of July deadline. A fee is charged for the tests. The fee can only be paid once you have registered to write the test. The tests should have been written by 11 August. Applicants are encouraged to write the tests as early as possible. For a comprehensive list of test dates, registration dates and available venues, please refer to the NBT website, www.nbt.ac.za. **ONLY** the first attempt results will be taken into account for selection purposes and thus it is not advisable to write the tests more than once in any year. The WAPT will be scheduled to take place on the designated date only. No alternative dates are available. Please note that no applicant may request a test. If documents are not submitted by the end of July, no further consideration will be given to your application. Applicants will need to start preparing well in advance of notification. All information about the content and nature of each of the components of the test is given on the GEMP website www.gemp.ac.za. Applicants have to register on the NBT website, www.nbt.ac.za.
