We want to confirm this information and determine any other information about this family collected by the census enumerator in Pennsylvania reel listing located at bottom of guide. The Internet can be a valuable tool to aid in your Census search. There are many sites that provide information. Census Online contains over 44, links to US census records, census calculators, and census forms from . The microfilm information and the internet information can be used together to complete a search for an individual. Links to Internet sources have been inserted throughout this document that complement and, in some cases, replace the print indexes or the census microfilm. Please note that the microfilm constitutes the primary source and should be consulted for errors in transcription. A blank census form can be viewed and printed to assist your collection of data from the microfilm. Please ASK the staff at the News and Microforms Library Reference Desk at any time for additional help or clarification about how to locate the sources or information. P45 in the Indexes and Guides Section. Locate the person you are searching in the Pennsylvania Census Index. Names are listed in alphabetical order by last name. To follow along with our example, you will find Foglesonger, Vendal on page . See Example 1 below. Only the Heads of Household names are listed in this census. Showing the entry for Foglesonger, Vendal on page . There are maps of Pennsylvania by state and by county in the Pennsylvania Census Index, preceding page one of the index. Review the entry information provided for each name entry in the Pennsylvania Census Index. We have highlighted in red the information for Foglesonger, Vendal in Example 1 above. Transcriptions Desserline Harris And Cousins The family connections between Virginia free and emancipated blacks emigrating to Liberia are frequent and layered. The life of Desserline Harris, free black emigrant from Alexandria to Liberia, serves as an example. The Harris family in Alexandria, father John Harris and children, Desserline and Bathsheba, were property owners and soap makers After the city of Alexandria left the District of Columbia and reverted to the state of Virginia in , John Harris and daughter Bathsheba moved to Washington City while Desserline Harris emigrated to Liberia in Although he encouraged his father and sister to follow and they made tentative inquiries, there is no record of their leaving the United States. How the Henry and Harris families are related is not clear, but they were able to keep track of their connection through migrations from the Tidewater to the Shenandoah Valley and to Alexandria. Patrick, Williamson, Dunkin and John V. Henry began as slaves in Westmoreland County, owned by Martin Tapscott, who freed their mother Lavinia and Williamson and intended to free Patrick, but died suddenly. Patrick purchased his freedom and somehow the other two brothers were freed. All four moved to Rockbridge County in the Shenandoah Valley. Thomas Jefferson hired Patrick Henry to be caretaker of Natural Bridge, a scenic rock natural wonder that Jefferson then owned. Henry was employed to work on the buildings and grounds of Washington College with Samuel Harris, apparently a cousin. If free blacks and emancipated slaves in Rockbridge County heard nothing bad in a year, they would migrate. To the consternation of local auxiliary officers, Harris wrote back that he and his family were having a very hard time. Colonizationists were furious and described him as "whining" and "babyish. Henry of Lexington, to accompany Diego Evans, leader of a subsequent group from that region. Henry sold his house and possessions and brought his family to Liberia with Evans in The prospective emigrants organized and left Rockbridge County in late Harris, started a mercantile firm, perhaps hoping to capitalize on their connections to the port of Alexandria. Harris announced that "John V. Henry and Company" will import and sell "I will say, most everything. Henry did not survive long and Desserline Harris, the ambitious and optimistic young entrepreneur from Alexandria, also died after several highly successful years in Liberia. The history of this family is murky in a manner similar to that of other relatively prosperous Virginia free blacks with white male patronage. What is known of their family networks raises more questions about their histories than it answers.
