You can also hop onto the World of Tanks forums and dive into the new player and game guide section of the forums which has a vast amount of useful information. Since it was difficult when I started to play World of Tanks for new players to learn how to play the game I have since started to write the guides and articles found here on WoT Guru. These guides are straightforward and tank specific in the tank guide section , and other guides will help you learn other useful bits for improving. This will allow you to always have tanks that are fully upgraded and capable of earning silver at a decent rate compared to new non-upgraded tanks that are difficult to play. It might be tempting to sell your current tank to fund the next tank but you will regret it. Keeping on this topic having experienced crews can be even more important than having a fully researched tank. Time to Make a Decision Tier 5 Tier 5 is a crucial point in World of Tanks where deciding what or how you want to play can make or break you enjoying the game. At this point advancing to higher tiers becomes much more difficult without a premium account or a premium tank due to the significant bump in experience and silver required to obtain the tanks and modules. If you decide you are content with continuing to play for free then keeping your goals centered from tier 6 and below is a wise decision. This will allow you to fully research and train crews on several tanks from the tier range while also gaining free experience and silver. For many the most balanced and enjoyable fights are around the tier range which also helps. The other route of spending some money and buying gold if you decide World of Tanks is a game for you becomes a viable option once you hit tier 5. By now you have a general understanding on how the game is played and how to be effective in battles. You also know if you did a little research which tanks you want to work towards in the higher tiers. For example if you are working towards the American heavy tanks T32,M,TE5 then buying an American heavy premium tank T14 or T34 will ease the grind down that line. Converting gold to silver or using it to convert left over experience to free experience is not ideal for a new player since advancing to quickly is not advised. Taking your time advancing up the tiers will make you a better player by slowly adapting to high tier matches and learning how to counter new tanks at a slower pace. One of the most difficult decisions to devoting your time to a specific tank line to work your way up to tier A lot of time is required to get to tier 10 and making a well thought out decision will save a lot of frustration. For new players I usually suggest doing the American heavy tank line which ends with the TE5 first and then make a decision on which will be your second tier 10 after that. By going down this line you get small tid bits of different play styles and then you will be able to decide if you want to go down a more mobile line, brawler line, heavy armor, etc. Like belowâ€ Sitting behind a bush with it remaining transparent allows you to spot advancing tanks with your view range. See belowâ€ However if you have teammates spotting tanks ahead of you simply sitting behind the bush with it being completely opaque will hide you even while firing. This leads to learning how to passive scout and active scout. At that point they will not fire on any tanks spotted but instead let their team pick off tanks from a safe distance and in return the passive scouter receives half of the experience and silver earned by each damaging shot as with all damage assisted via spotting. The final form of scouting is active scouting which is personally

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Character Creation[\[edit edit source \]](#) The character creation screen After choosing which mode to play, click on New at the character selection screen to create a new character. Once at the character creation screen, you will see all the character properties that can be customized. None of the settings are mandatory and you can skip any number of them. You can even skip all of them and head directly to the next section, Finishing Up , below. Hair, Eyes, Skin, and Clothes. These settings are purely cosmetic and do not affect gameplay. The Clothes menu has four more options to choose from. The color of your clothes can be changed in-game using a Dresser. In order to pick colors, use the sliders provided. Hair color and style can be changed later with the help of the Stylist NPC. **Difficulty**[\[edit edit source \]](#) A Character Difficulty mode must be chosen in the PC and Console versions, but there is no character difficulty option in the mobile version where you will see that Softcore is displayed by default. For your first Terraria experience, it is recommended that you leave your character in Softcore mode. It is the easiest mode, and will make learning how to play a more pleasant experience. The character difficulty setting determines what happens when the character dies - it does not affect any other aspects of gameplay, including how hard the enemies will be. Softcore mode is the easiest difficulty. It is also the default mode presented to the player. When the character dies, it will drop half of the currently carried coins onto the ground. The inventory otherwise remains intact, and any coins dropped this way can be retrieved from where they were dropped. Mediumcore mode is the second mode presented to the player. When the character dies, all items, coins, and ammo will drop. Just as with coins, the dropped items can be retrieved from where they were dropped. However, under certain circumstances items dropped this way can wind up permanently destroyed for example, if they fall into lava. Hardcore mode is the harshest mode presented to the player - it is essentially permanent death. All items will be dropped, the character will turn into a ghost, and will be deleted upon logging out. Other players in a multiplayer game may help retrieve the dropped items, but in single player they are gone forever. This mode is not recommended for the purposes of this guide. Hardcore mode is not the same thing as Hardmode , which occurs in the later stages of the game at any difficulty setting. **Finishing Up**[\[edit edit source \]](#) Click Create to confirm character creation with the settings chosen or defaults, if none were changed. The next screen asks you to enter a name for the character, so type a name and click Accept. This marks the end of character creation - the newly created character will be added to the list of characters in the menu. At the character selection list, pick your character. The World selection screen will display. **World Creation**[\[edit edit source \]](#) Select New. You will be presented with 3 World Size options: Small, Medium, and Large. Small worlds are relatively compact. The oceans are closer to the starting point, and the entire world is not as deep. Medium worlds are roughly halfway between small and large worlds in size. Traveling to the edges will take a new player roughly 1 in-game day 15 minutes in real time. Large worlds are massive. To reach the deepest sections of the map will take quite a while, and the oceans are several days apart. We recommend you create a small world for your first Terraria experience. After selecting a world size, you will be asked to choose between Normal and Expert mode. Normal worlds offer the standard Terraria experience. Expert worlds have harder enemies, advanced boss fights, and exclusive Expert items. For now, select normal. Simply type any name you like, and when done select Accept. This marks the end of World Creation - the newly created world will be added to the list of worlds in the menu. At the world selection list, pick your world to load the game. **Beginning Gameplay**[\[edit edit source \]](#) A sample Terraria world Upon entering a world for the first time, your character will spawn be placed into the game at the center of the map, so you have half of the world to explore to the left, and half to the right. This location is known as the Spawn Point or simply, the "Spawn" and will be where your character is placed each time this world is entered. Most world spawn points are located in Forest biomes but sometimes in a Snow biome as well. **Movement and Tool Use**[\[edit edit source \]](#) Movement uses the keyboard, while most

interactions like mining, building, and fighting use the mouse. For a quick recap of the available keys or the controls for other devices, see the game controls page. The letter A makes the character go left. The letter D makes the character go right. The Space button makes the character jump. The letter S makes the character fall through platforms and climb down ropes. The letter W makes the character climb up ropes. Left clicking is used to exert items and weapons, depending on what you are holding. Tapping and holding will break blocks with appropriate tool Tapping with a block in hand will place it. Tapping a consumable item in the hotbar or tapping with it in your hand will consume it if it is in your hand. Right clicking is used to interact with NPCs and Chests. The hotbar[edit edit source] In the upper-left corner of the screen are ten boxes numbered from 1 to 0 zero. These are special Inventory slots referred to as the "hotbar", and they contain the items you currently have access to for use. Press the Esc key to see the rest of the inventory slots; if you have autopause toggled on, opening the inventory also pauses the game. Press the Esc key again to close the inventory. All newly created characters begin with the following tools in the hotbar: Items do have a chance for a modifier such as "Light Copper Pickaxe" as all items do when found or crafted. The Copper Pickaxe is a tool used to dig blocks , as well as detaching placed items like furniture. When selected, hold down the left mouse button to use it continuously. The Copper Axe is a tool used for chopping down trees to obtain wood. Some weapons can be used continuously "autofire" while others require a click for each attack. The slot of the currently selected item in the hotbar will be slightly larger than the other slots and have a highlighted background color, with the name of the item listed above the hotbar. This item will be used when you click the left mouse button. The current selection can be changed by: To toggle the feature back on simply click on the padlock one more time to unlock it again. Rearranging the hotbar[edit edit source] Items on the hotbar can only be changed when the inventory is open. However, items within the hotbar can be rearranged by simply dragging them. This is accomplished by dragging the items to switch them. Try it now with the Copper Axe: If you move the mouse pointer now you will see the axe attached to it. Point to one of the empty slots in the lower portion of the inventory, and click once more to place the axe down in the slot. Items in storage slots cannot be used directly when the inventory is closed, unlike items in the hotbar - they are simply being carried by your character. Move the axe back to a hotbar slot. While the inventory is open you may pick up and rearrange the items in the hotbar to your liking. The inventory[edit edit source] Below the hotbar is the remainder of the inventory. Additionally, you have a trash slot, and columns of 4 slots apiece for coins and ammunition. On the lower right is a separate section for equipment and accessories, while below left is the Crafting section. For the purposes of this guide these sections will be ignored - you can look them up later in the detailed Inventory article. Each red heart is 20 health. All characters begin with health points indicated by five hearts and can currently go up to via Life Crystals red hearts , then further boosted to with Life Fruits golden hearts. Health starts regenerating after a short period of not taking further damage. Standing still increases the rate of regeneration. Each blue star is 20 mana. New characters start with 20 mana, represented by 1 star. As the maximum mana is increased , by using Mana Crystals blue stars , additional stars will be displayed below the original. Mana regenerates shortly after mana usage is stopped, and at a much faster baseline rate compared to health regeneration. For more details on health and mana, refer to the respective articles.

What you have here is a brief synopsis of best practice strategies: How To Prepare for the Conversation Before going into the conversation, ask yourself some questions: What is your purpose for having the conversation? What do you hope to accomplish? What would be an ideal outcome? Watch for hidden purposes. You may think you have honorable goals, like educating an employee or increasing connection with your teen, only to notice that your language is excessively critical or condescending. You think you want to support, but you end up punishing. Some purposes are more useful than others. Work on yourself so that you enter the conversation with a supportive purpose. Impact does not necessarily equal intent. Are you more emotional than the situation warrants? What personal history is being triggered? How is your attitude toward the conversation influencing your perception of it? If you think this is going to be horribly difficult, it probably will be. If you truly believe that whatever happens, some good will come of it, that will likely be the case. Try to adjust your attitude for maximum effectiveness. Who is the opponent? What might he be thinking about this situation? Is he aware of the problem? If so, how do you think he perceives it? What are his needs and fears? What solution do you think he would suggest? Begin to reframe the opponent as partner. What are your needs and fears? Are there any common concerns? How have you contributed to the problem? How has the other person? Breathe, center, and continue to notice when you become off center—and choose to return again. This is where your power lies. Centering is not a step; centering is how you are as you take the steps. For more on Centering, see the Resource section at the end of the article. Inquiry Cultivate an attitude of discovery and curiosity. What does he really want? What is he not saying? Let your partner talk until he is finished. Try to learn as much as you can in this phase of the conversation. Try to understand the other person so well you can make his argument for him. Guess at his hopes and honor his position. He will not change unless he sees that you see where he stands. Acknowledge whatever you can, including your own defensiveness if it comes up. You can decide later how to address it. For example, in an argument with a friend, I said: I just want to talk about this topic. Acknowledgment can be difficult if we associate it with agreement. Help clarify your position without minimizing his. And I think I am. Maybe we can talk about how to address these issues so that my intention is clear. Brainstorming and continued inquiry are useful here. Whatever he says, find something you like and build on it. If the conversation becomes adversarial, go back to inquiry. Practice, Practice, Practice The art of conversation is like any art—with continued practice you will acquire skill and ease. Here are some additional tips and suggestions: A successful outcome will depend on two things: How you are centered, supportive, curious, problem-solving will greatly influence what you say. Know and return to your purpose at difficult moments. Practice the conversation with a friend before holding the real one. Mentally practice the conversation. See various possibilities and visualize yourself handling them with ease. Envision the outcome you are hoping for. How Do I Begin? Visit Website Did you know? Even in the early 21st century, the legacy of the Holocaust endures. Swiss government and banking institutions have in recent years acknowledged their complicity with the Nazis and established funds to aid Holocaust survivors and other victims of human rights abuses, genocide or other catastrophes. On January 20, 1933, he was named chancellor of Germany. At first, the Nazis reserved their harshest persecution for political opponents such as Communists or Social Democrats. The first official concentration camp opened at Dachau near Munich in March 1933, and many of the first prisoners sent there were Communists. Like the network of concentration camps that followed, becoming the killing grounds of the Holocaust, Dachau was under the control of Heinrich Himmler, head of the elite Nazi guard, the Schutzstaffel SS, and later chief of the German police. In 1933, Jews in Germany numbered around 1.5 million, or only 1 percent of the total German population. Under the Nuremberg Laws of 1935, anyone with three or four Jewish grandparents was considered a Jew, while those with two Jewish grandparents were designated Mischlinge half-breeds. Under the Nuremberg Laws, Jews became routine targets for stigmatization and persecution. From 1933 to 1945, hundreds of thousands of Jews who were able to leave Germany did, while those who remained lived in a constant state of uncertainty and fear. German police soon forced tens of thousands of Polish Jews from their homes and into ghettos, giving their confiscated properties to ethnic Germans non-Jews outside Germany who identified as German, Germans from the Reich or Polish gentiles. Surrounded by high walls and barbed wire, the Jewish ghettos in Poland functioned like captive city-states, governed by Jewish Councils. In addition to widespread unemployment, poverty and hunger, overpopulation made the ghettos breeding grounds for disease such as typhus. Meanwhile, beginning in the fall of 1941, Nazi officials selected around 70,000 Germans institutionalized for mental illness or disabilities to be gassed to death in the so-called Euthanasia Program. After prominent German religious leaders protested, Hitler put an end to the program in August 1941, though killings of the disabled continued in secrecy, and by 1945, people deemed handicapped from all over Europe had been killed. In hindsight, it seems clear that the Euthanasia Program functioned as a pilot for the Holocaust. Beginning in 1942, Jews from all over the continent, as well as hundreds of thousands of European Gypsies, were transported to the Polish ghettos. The German invasion of the Soviet Union in June 1941 marked a new level of brutality in warfare. Mobile killing units called Einsatzgruppen would murder more than 3 million Soviet Jews and others usually by shooting over the course of the German occupation. Since June 1941, experiments with mass killing methods had been ongoing at the concentration camp of Auschwitz, near Krakow. The SS soon placed a huge order for the gas with a German pest-control firm, an ominous indicator of the coming Holocaust. Holocaust Death Camps, Beginning in late 1941, the Germans began mass transports from the ghettos in Poland to the concentration camps, starting with those people viewed as the least useful: The first mass gassings began at the camp of Belzec, near Lublin, on March 17, 1942. Five more mass killing centers were built at camps in occupied Poland, including Chelmno, Sobibor, Treblinka, Majdanek and the largest of all, Auschwitz-Birkenau. From 1942 to 1945, Jews were deported to the camps from all over Europe, including German-controlled territory as well as those countries allied with Germany. The heaviest deportations took place during the summer and fall of 1942, when more than 1 million people were deported from the Warsaw ghetto alone. Though the Nazis tried to keep operation of camps secret, the scale of the killing made this virtually impossible. Eyewitnesses brought reports of Nazi atrocities in Poland to the Allied governments, who were harshly criticized after the war for their failure to respond, or to publicize news of the mass slaughter. This lack of action was likely mostly due to the Allied focus on winning the war at hand, but was also a result of the general incomprehension with which news of the Holocaust was met and the denial and disbelief that such atrocities could be occurring on such a scale. At Auschwitz alone, more than 2 million people were murdered in a process resembling a large-scale industrial operation. A large population of Jewish and non-Jewish inmates worked in the labor camp there; though only Jews were gassed, thousands of others died of starvation

or disease. Nazi Rule Comes to an End, as Holocaust Continues to Claim Lives, By the spring of , German leadership was dissolving amid internal dissent, with Goering and Himmler both seeking to distance themselves from Hitler and take power. The following day, he committed suicide. The last trace of civilization had vanished around and inside us. The work of bestial degradation, begun by the victorious Germans, had been carried to conclusion by the Germans in defeat. Survivors of the camps found it nearly impossible to return home, as in many cases they had lost their families and been denounced by their non-Jewish neighbors. As a result, the late s saw an unprecedented number of refugees, POWs and other displaced populations moving across Europe. In an effort to punish the villains of the Holocaust, the Allies held the Nuremberg Trials of , which brought Nazi atrocities to horrifying light. Increasing pressure on the Allied powers to create a homeland for Jewish survivors of the Holocaust would lead to a mandate for the creation of Israel in

But consciously we rarely do. But then something happens to wake us up. Our parents get divorced. The girl down the street gets abducted. A relative gets cancer. That wakes us up for awhile. But then we can often sink back into the denial. That is, until another tragedy hits, another incongruence. Something is really, really wrong. So, WHY do bad things happen? There is an answer to the WHY question, found in the Bible. What or who could make this world different than the way it is? What or who could guarantee that life is pain-free, for everyone, all the time? God could accomplish that. At least not right now. Remember the story of Adam and Eve? They ate the "forbidden fruit. For Adam and Eve sort of hoped that they could become like God, without God. They consumed the notion that there was something more valuable in existence than God himself, something more valuable than having a personal relationship with God. And this world system -- with all of its faults -- came as a result of the choice they made. But thanks for the offer. Why do we do that? All of these can be explained by people who have refused to give God access and influence over their lives. They are going about their lives as they see fit, and they and others suffer. In fact, God could rightly be viewed as leaning forward, compassionate, hoping we will turn to him so that he can bring real life to us. Jesus said, "Come to me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. Jesus commented on this when he said: He who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. What about those horrible circumstances that hit us in life, caused by someone other than ourselves? God more than understands what you are going through. There is nothing in life that could be more painful than what Jesus endured on our behalf, when he was deserted by his friends, ridiculed by those who would not believe in him, beaten and tortured before his crucifixion, then nailed to a cross, in shameful public display, dying of slow suffocation. He created us, yet allowed humanity the freedom to do this, to fulfill Scripture and to set us free from our sin. This was no surprise to Jesus. He was aware of what was coming, foreknowing all the details, all the pain, all the humiliation. Jesus understands emotional and psychological anguish. The night that Jesus knew they would arrest him, he went to pray, but took some friends with him. Here it is summarized, as John describes in his gospel: He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. Some of it is explained by selfish, hateful actions on the part of others. Some of it defies an explanation in this life. But God offers us himself. God gives us the knowledge that he has endured also, and is aware of our pain and needs. Jesus said to his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. He is after all, God, the Creator. The one who has always existed. The one who created a universe on the backstroke. And if we will trust him with our lives, relying on him, though we encounter difficulties, he will hold us securely. Jesus said, "These things I have spoken to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world. He can take us through the difficult circumstances of this life, and then bring us into eternal life, if we will trust him. We can either go through this life with God or without him. Jesus prayed, "O righteous Father, although the world has not known you, yet I have known you; and these have known that you sent me; and I have made your name known to them, and will make it known, so that the love with which you loved me may be in them, and I in them.
