We look today at a complex multinational organization like IBM and forget that the company began in the mind of a single human being. Anyone who starts or causes to be started a business venture, is an entrepreneur. They cannot think otherwise. Yet, at the time of Columbus, not a single live dragon had ever been seen upon the planet earth by anyone. Dragons were, in fact, fairytale creatures, yet they always inhabited the uncharted regions of the world. It said so right on the maps. Let it turn while you view it from every angle. Look at it from the standpoint of the worst possible scenario. It usually takes longer than we realize when we begin. Laughing and entertaining with a blunt and earthy humor, ESTP personalities love to be the center of attention.
