

**Chapter 1 : The Juliette Society : Sasha Grey :**

*"The Juliette Society is erotica with a difference Definitely one to add to your reading list."*

As the story occurs, Juliet is approaching her fourteenth birthday. Her birthday is "a fortnight hence", putting the action of the play in mid-July 1. Club di Giulietta[ edit ] Since the s, letters addressed to Juliet keep arriving in Verona. As of , more than 5, letters were received annually, three-quarters of which were from women. The largest single group of senders was American teenagers. Mary Saunderson was the first woman to play Juliet professionally. Previous actors had all been males. Peggy Ashcroft was one of the great Juliets in history, most famously in the London production directed by John Gielgud, in which Gielgud and Laurence Olivier alternated the roles of Romeo and Mercutio.

Peter, a serving man, is dispatched to give out invitations and unwittingly invites Romeo. The Nurse also encourages Juliet. A masked Romeo, Mercutio and Benvolio enter the Capulet celebration. Romeo tells of a dream he had about the consequences for attending the celebration: Capulet welcomes the masked revelers and invites them to dance. Romeo notices Juliet among the guests and instantly falls in love with her. Tybalt notices Romeo and informs Capulet of his presence offering to remove him. Capulet allows Romeo to stay in order to preserve the peace. Meanwhile, Romeo has located Juliet and the couple kisses. Act 2 Scene 1: Upon leaving the Capulet grounds with his kinsman, Romeo has run off and hid himself in the trees. Romeo sees Juliet on her balcony and overhears her profess her love for him. Romeo responds in kind and they decide to marry the next day. Juliet is called away by her Nurse and Romeo bids her farewell. Romeo asks Friar Lawrence to marry him to Juliet. The Friar chastises Romeo for being fickle and asks what happened to his love for Rosalind. Romeo dismisses his love for Rosalind and explains the urgency of his request. Mercutio informs Benvolio that Tybalt has threatened to kill Mercutio. Romeo is with Friar Lawrence as Juliet hastily arrives. The Friar resolves to marry them quickly. Act 3 Scene 1: Tybalt challenges Romeo, who attempts to pacify the situation. The Prince arrives and banishes Romeo. The Nurse explains that her cousin, Tybalt, has been killed by Romeo. The Nurse goes to find him. Friar Lawrence informs Romeo that he is to be banished. Friar Lawrence encourages Romeo to visit Juliet and fulfill their marriage contract before going to exile. Capulet and his wife explain to Paris that Juliet is too upset about Tybalt to consider his marriage proposal. Capulet then decides to arrange for Juliet to marry Paris the following Thursday. Romeo bids Juliet an emotional farewell after spending the night together. Juliet is told that she is to marry Paris on Thursday.
