For , Audi will offer its brand-new Q8 , yet another choice for personal luxury buyers looking for a sporty crossover. Part of the rationale is that in this segment, styling is of utmost importance. Audi designers drew inspiration for the Q8 from the original Quattro Coupe from the s. The styling link is most apparent in the form of blistered fender arches at all four corners. The Q8 is 2. An upper panel measuring Maps, audio, and other infotainment features display on this panel, which is also touch sensitive. One unique feature that makes MMI much more user friendly than some competing systems are shortcut icons that can be added in a row across the lower LCD panel. These shortcuts can include anything from a frequently used GPS destination to the phone number of a friend or family member. We found the system mostly intuitive to use, once we figured out that a solid press was required to make selections and get any helpful haptic feedback. Instead of a traditional gauge cluster, the digital dashboard is configurable to show all kinds of useful information, our favorite being a big, bright map with GPS driving directions. An optional head-up display further reduces the need for the driver to move their eyes from the road. The heated, cooled and massaging front seats of our test car were lovely perches on which to watch the stunning desert landscape fly by. The rear seats are roomy enough for two passengers of above-average height to get nice and comfortable. Shared with the Q7, it puts out horsepower and pound-feet of torque and sends that power through an eight-speed automatic transmission to all four wheels. A volt battery allows Audi to integrate its mild-hybrid technology, which is capable of recovering energy that would otherwise be lost to braking and reuse it to help power the vehicle. The V6 powerplant generally feels up to the job of moving the big 4,pound SUV around, but, on our drive route that briefly crested 15, feet in elevation, there were times that the turbo mill was left huffing, puffing, and forcing the transmission to hold gears for an uncomfortably long time. While most owners will never feel the effects of that kind of elevation, the turbocharged 3. Fortunately for power junkies, we already know a more powerful SQ8 is on the way. We found these buttons awfully fiddly to work with, especially when attempting to change modes while moving. We found the Comfort mode to be a pretty good all-around setting for the Q8. Dynamic mode alters the ratio and adds weight to the steering, and if the vehicle is fitted with optional air dampers, it also firms up the suspension. And that pretty much sums up the Audi Q8. The world does not need another coupe-like four-door crossover. The Audi Q8 somehow manages to blend style and utility in a unique way, offering a more practical choice for style-conscious buyers who still want or need a useable back seat and cargo area. Now, buyers can choose between coupe-like crossovers from all three of the big German luxury brands. And of those three, the Audi has the most technology, the most stylish interior, and even the healthiest dose of practicality. Whether or not it has enough style to attract buyers in this segment, though, is what will ultimately be the deciding factor in its success.

Posted on 18 July 3 comments Dear Readers: From my experience in working among people in post-hazard environments, I can conclude that a stable house is the most prized possession. I have witnessed the grateful expressions of relief among those whose houses survived the tragic events. The contrasting near hopeless expressions of misery among those whose houses were destroyed were almost unbearable. It was after my first deployment to Haiti after the earthquake, that I finally understood that the primary purpose of an elected Government is to protect, as much as possible, the residents from foreseeable harm. It is for this reason why it is absolutely essential for each Government in the hazard prone Caribbean region to regulate the residential construction building industry in their country. The Government of Barbados took the first step in trying to protect the public from certain post-hazard misery by publishing the Barbados National Building Code in [The Fire and the Fire Chief]. That was a commendable achievement because at that time, Barbados was experiencing an economic recession and political turmoil. Fortuitously, the national building standard was in place for the unprecedented building boom that would commence one year later, in It is a national disgrace that strains the limits of irresponsibility that the Government of Barbados, against all expert advice [The Construction Horror Show] , allowed an entirely unregulated year building boom with respect to building standards. Of the thousands of houses built, almost all of them are vulnerable to collapse in a major earthquake [Weapons of Mass Destruction]. By , the legacy of substandard residential construction was firmly established in Barbados [Happy Birthday Building Code]. At the start of that year, an earthquake in Haiti had reportedly killed approximately , people [In Defense of the Haitian Structural Engineer]. Near the end of that year, tropical storm Tomas examined Barbados and damaged over 1, houses. Following the visit, our Prime Minister reportedly made the following accurate observation: With such ministerial statements, a strong response was eagerly anticipated. Approximately two years later, around the 20th anniversary of the initial publication of the National Building Code, the Government of Barbados took the strongest possible action unimaginable. Against expert advice, the Government abolished the only national standard designed to help builders construct a house that could survive earthquakes and hurricanes [Good Code Gone Bad]. This act of utter stupidity placed Barbados in the unenviable position of being perhaps the only country on the planet that did not provide some type of structural building guidance to its residents. Even in the poorest country in the world, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, a homeowner could have found more relevant building standards than in Barbados. It is a national shame to which our apathy only encourages our Government to act more irresponsibly, to depths formerly thought practically unreachable. It simply does not make any sense! Why would a Government allow an unregulated building boom, despite repeated warnings of the fatal consequences? Should Barbados experience the inevitable major earthquake tomorrow, then these two actions, in retrospect, would be justifiably deemed unforgivable. If you have read this far, then you already know how it happened. What you do not know is why, and Barbadians have a right to know, right now! The Government of Barbados is fully aware of the estimated losses. Recent seismic studies of Barbados Salazar et al, have shown that Barbados is significantly more at risk to major earthquakes than predicted by the UN. Based on the latest earthquake design parameters Bozzoni et al, , it can be reasonably assumed that all buildings with reinforced concrete floors in Barbados, that were built before and not updated to the current design standards, are expected to collapse during a major earthquake, killing most of the people inside. This includes schools, houses and commercial buildings. Unlike hurricanes, earthquakes normally strike without warning. It is freely available on the Internet. Through His Word, God reveals things He will bring upon the earth. This man was Belchazzar, the grandson of Nebuchadnezzar. Belchazzar ordered a party for all the heads of his government. He called for all the gold and silver vessels Nebuchadnezzar had brought from the temple of God when he destroyed Jerusalem. Belchazzar was going to serve his guests wine in these vessels. They openly and defiantly made a mockery of all those things that had been dedicated to God for His service. This was a direct message to Belchazzar. The name Belchazzar means "the lord of destruction has straitened". God informed Belchazzar he had been weighed in the balances and was found wanting. Today God is weighing each member of his body in the balances. The Lord of destruction will bring straitening in the lives of those who are found wanting. We do not use balances any more for weighing objects, we now use scales. The way the balances worked was you put a weight on one side of the balance, and equal weight was added on the other side, until the balances weighed equal. If balances do not balance equally, then they are said to be "out of balance". When our lives are not in balance with the things God has given us in His Word, then our lives, too, are out of balance. If we weighed our knowledge of His glorious Word against our knowledge of worldly things would the scales balance, or would our worldly knowledge outweigh our knowledge of God? If our willingness to serve God was weighed against our desire to serve self, would the scales balance, or would our desire to serve self tip the balance in favor of self instead of God. If our bank account was weighed against the treasures we have laid up in heaven, which way would the scales be tipped? Would He say, "I have numbered your kingdom and finished it? This judgment is called the Wrath of God. We need to consider the lives of four men who were weighed in the balances and found wanting. These men are Nebuchadnezzar, Jacob, Isaiah, and Paul. When these four men were weighed in the balances and found wanting, they changed. And for the majesty that he gave him, all people, nations, and languages, trembled and feared before him: But when his heart was lifted up, and his mind hardened in pride, he was deposed from his kingly throne, and they took his glory from him: And he was driven from the sons of men; and his heart was made like the beasts, and his dwelling was with the wild asses: But when his heart mind was lifted up and hardened with pride, God gave him the mind of a beast, and he made his dwelling with the wild asses. Spiritually speaking, the wild asses are those who are under no ones authority. They go where they want. They do as they please. Their pride has hardened their heart until they digress to the mind of a beast. Nebuchadnezzar was deposed from his kingdom, "till he knew the most high God ruled in the kingdom of men". Daniel continued to speak to Belshazzar: Pride had hardened his heart. This is the same condition most Christians have fallen into. They will no longer humble themselves in the sight of the Lord. Nebuchadnezzar was given a beast mind and put out to pasture until he learned the power and authority of God in his life. Nebuchadnezzar was weighed in the balances and found wanting, but Nebuchadnezzar changed his heart before God. After his lesson was learned and his kingdom was restored, he proclaimed: Unfortunately even though Belchazzar knew and understood the fate of his grandfather, he did not learn. Daniel related to Belchazzar: Man has made these gods by the works of his own hands. Daniel informed Belshazzar that he was not glorifying the God who held his next breath in his hand. Many need to learn the lesson Nebuchadnezzar had to learn, and repent. They need to learn the Most High God rules in the kingdom of men. They can learn and live, or they can be as Belshazzar and continue to desecrate the vessels of God, and lose their kingdom and their lives. Jacob The next man who was weighed in the balances and found wanting was Jacob. Jacob

was the younger brother of Esau, the son of Isaac. But instead of Rachel, Laban gave him Leah. Laban had deceived Jacob. Jacob was now reaping the deception he had sown. Jacob was to labor for another seven years for Rachel. As Jacob journeyed, he came to the place called "Peniel". The word Peniel means "turn ye to God". One of the first steps in growing in God is recognizing our need in God. Today in the church, we have many who have settled for their birthright in God, never going any further than salvation. Then there are those who are content with their blessing in God, the baptism of the Holy Ghost. But there must be those who recognize, as Jacob did, a further need in their life. Once we recognize our need, we must be willing to wrestle with God until we receive it. Jude spoke of our wrestling with God to get what we desire: When many today ask God for forgiveness of their sin, they believe they are home free. They believe all they need to do is to hang on or do good. They operate in some of the gifts and believe they have arrived. They truly believe they have all God has to offer, yet they do not display the fruit of the Spirit in their lives. Their lives do not display the love of God, they have little joy, and no peace. When trouble comes, they blame Satan for their suffering, instead of realizing God is trying to develop the fruit of longsuffering in their lives. As for gentleness, faith, meekness, temperance, lowliness, righteousness, and patience; they all seem to be lacking in some degree. These have a need, but fail to recognize their need before their God. Their pride will not allow them to humble themselves to wrestle with God for all He has for them. But God is looking for a people who, like Jacob, are not willing to settle for their birthright and blessing, but will contend with God to attain to the high calling of Christ Jesus in their life. When Jacob wrestled with God he was contending for the faith. He was not going to let go until he had received his desire from His God. Jacob would walk with a limp from that day forward. Anytime we contend with God for the faith, He will change our walk. No longer will we be satisfied with things that please the flesh. Our only desire will be those things pleasing to our God. We cannot truly say we are walking in the Spirit until we have dealt with our lust of the flesh. Paul continued his admonition to the churches at Galatia: God had to cripple Jacob so he would never forget his encounter with God. Today many in the church are crippled. They are crippled in their mind because their thinking processes do not glorify God. They are crippled in their feet because their walk before God is not clean. They are crippled in their hands because their service before their God is lacking. They have no time for God, nor interest in the things of God. Jacob wrestled with God until the dawning of the New Day. And he said, I will not let thee go, except thou bless me. He would not let go of God until he received a further blessing. If we too are to succeed, we must hold on until we receive what we are seeking from our God. Our fleshly desires must give way to our spiritual need. Jacob recognized his birthright and blessing was not enough. We too must realize our birthright and blessing is not enough. We need God to change our walk.
