The series began with 25 titles and new volumes were added almost every year. Although each of the formats state the American Boys Series somewhere on the cover or spine, some of the books have no publication dates within the book or in the ads. Instead only the original copyright appears on the copyright page. So you buy an Optic, Kellogg, Morecamp, DeMille, Kingston, Optic, etc, authored book advertised as an original early book and you get stuck. Lee and Shepard, You will note that the description above matches the second format of the American Boys Series described below. It is book 84 and was published between The American Boys Series formats are shown here. They all were dust jacketed. I have seen three formats. He would swim, sail, farm, and fish with the boys in his parish and then, at an unexpected moment, kneel down in their boat, or in the field, and pray with them. Nearby Bowdoin College often sent difficult students to stay with him for a few weeks in hopes of setting them on a constructive path. For eighteen years thereafter he turned to writing. After that, the books came thick and fast, so that by there were twenty-nine in all. His stories deal with the life and adventures of people along the shores of Casco Bay , of Scotch-Irish settlers on the western frontier of Pennsylvania, and of the students of Bowdoin College during or just before his own college days. His boys are not pirates or savages, neither are they plaster saints. While they do not depreciate book-learning, they place a high value upon the ability to do all kinds of manual work. Although the language in which they are told sometimes shows signs of haste and often seems homely, it is quaint and idiomatic, and the tales give unmistakable evidence that the author knew well both the speech and the life of the people about whom he wrote. In Kellogg returned to Harpswell, to his old church, and for the rest of his life he preached there or in the neighboring town of Topsham.
